Gov Eno Unveils Electricity Roadmap

·Ready to tackle power challenge in A'Ibom



overnor Umo Eno, has unveiled a bold initiative to overhaul the State's electricity sector, pledging improved availability, affordability, and accessibility of power supply.

Speaking while declaring open a two-day Electricity Summit at Four-Points by Sheraton, Ikot Ekpene, on Thursday, September 18, the Governor described the event as a turning point for the

energy future of the State.

Governor Eno, lamented the paradox of Akwa Ibom's rich energy resources, including gas reserves and a state-owned power plant, yet persistent epileptic power supply across homes, schools, hospitals, and businesses. He questioned why the Ibom Power Company, with an installed capacity of 191MW, has failed to operate optimally


since its establishment in 2001 despite heavy investment.

Stressing that the summit must go beyond deliberations to actionable steps, with a clear roadmap and defined timelines, the State Chief Executive reiterated that electricity should be treated not as a luxury, but as a basic necessity and enabler of development, pledging reforms guided by the State Electricity Policy 2024 and Electricity Law 2025.

He called for stronger collaboration between the Federal and State Governments as envisioned under Nigeria's Electricity Act, assuring investors of a level playing field and facilities for clean energy production. According to him, Akwa Ibom is integrating renewable and clean energy solutions into its developmental agenda to power critical facilities such as healthcare centres and schools.

Highlighting sustainability measures, the Governor revealed that the State's Compressed Natural Gas mass transit programme, the introduction of electric vehicles, and renewable energy initiatives are part of deliberate steps to cut emissions, reduce costs, and build a cleaner energy future. He assured transparent and citizen-focused electricity governance to position Akwa Ibom as a model for sub-national reforms in Nigeria.

In her welcome remarks, the Deputy Governor and Chairman of the State Electricity Reform Committee, Senator Akon Eyakenyi, explained that





the summit seeks to align politics, policy, and investment with technical and financial reforms that could deliver universal electricity access. She emphasised the State's determination to ensure clean, affordable, and sustainable power supply for its citizens.

The Minister of Power, Chief Adebayo Adelabu, represented by his Chief Technical Adviser, Mr. Adedayo Olowoniyi, commended the state's resolve and assured of the Federal Government support. Similarly, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, Hon. Tajudeen Abbas, represented by Hon. Victor Nwokolo, lauded Governor Eno's courage and foresight, while representatives of Governors of Enugu, Abia, Cross River, and Bayelsa States, alongside the National Security Adviser, Mallam Nuhu Ribadu, pledged collaboration.

The summit also featured goodwill messages from stakeholders including, Senator Ekong Sampson and a keynote address by Eyo Ekpo of the UK-

Nigeria Infrastructure Advisory Facility, who outlined five strategic reform priorities, as well as the unveiling of the Akwa Ibom State Electricity Policy and Electricity Law by Governor Eno, alongside dignitaries and senior government officials.

The two-day summit, convened by the State government, climaxed with the Governor's plan to set up a State Electricity Regulatory Commission and an Electrification Agency.



Pastor Eno Approves 1000 Recruitment for the Judiciary, as New Legal Year Commences



astor Umo Eno, has approved the recruitment of 1,000 staff into the Akwa Ibom State Judiciary, aimed at strengthening the system for speedy dispensation of justice.

The Governor, who made the announcement, on Monday, September 15, during an interdenominational church service, held at The Believers Assembly Nigeria, to mark the opening of the 2025/2026 legal year, also disclosed that provisions would be made in the 2026 budget for the construction of Evidence Rooms in select police stations in Uyo, to fast-track convictions and ensure justice for those who may be exonerated by evidence.

Governor Eno emphasised that all applicants will be engaged strictly through the State employment portal. He commended the State Chief Judge, Justice Ekaete Obot, for the robust collaboration between the Executive and Judiciary, assuring that his administration will continue to provide a conducive

environment for effective justice delivery.

The Governor further lauded the judiciary's role in maintaining peace and order, warning against attempts by individuals or groups to undermine the State's peace. He stressed that perceived injustices should be addressed through the courts rather than through subjudicial actions, and congratulated the judiciary on the commencement of a new legal year.

Leading members of the judiciary in thanksgiving, the Chief Judge, Justice

Ekaete Obot, appreciated God for sustaining the arm of government and thanked Governor Eno for creating a Judiciary Village and other welfare packages for judicial officers. She pledged continued partnership with the Executive for the peace and development of the State.

Earlier in his sermon, the Prelate of Believers Assembly, Prof. Isaiah Issong, underscored the need to enthrone the rule of law. He prayed that judges in the State will be known not only for their knowledge of the law but for their fear of God, while lawyers will serve as ministers of truth. He added that no person should be too powerful to be corrected, and no one, too poor to be protected.





4th EAP Cohort Kicks Off with Inauguration of A'lbom Entrepreneurs Association



Assistant to the Governor on Entrepreneurial Development and Director-General of Ibom-LED, Mr. Ime Uwah outlined the Governor's vision for the EAP.

The programme, as stated by Uwah, has so far trained 1,200 entrepreneurs, with 500 more to benefit in the current cohort. He further explained that Ibom-LED actively monitors and evaluates businesses after training to ensure long-term sustainability and impact.

he fourth Cohort of the Entrepreneurship Accelerator Programme (EAP), has been flagged off by Governor Umo Eno, as part of his administration's commitment to nurturing new business leaders and entrepreneurial development through the ARISE Agenda.

Speaking at the Ibom-LED Complex in Uyo, on Monday, September 15, Governor Eno charged participants to approach the 10-week training with discipline, passion, and commitment, disclosing that government would provide each trainee with N500, 000 grant as a foundation for their business journey.

He urged them to deploy the funds wisely in cognisant of the fact that it is not the amount that matters, but the passion to succeed, recalling how he started his chain of businesses with just a 5-room hotel, affirming that through dedication, commitment, focus and grace of

God, it metamorphosed into a bigger organisation.

The Governor also highlighted his administration's prudent financial management, noting that Akwa Ibom State has operated without borrowing for over two years. This, he said, has enabled continued investments in projects and initiatives like the EAP and the Dakkada Skills Acquisition Centre (DASAC).

Earlier in his remarks, the Senior Special

In a goodwill message, the Team Lead of Ibom-LED and Managing Director of the Akwa Ibom Investment Corporation (AKICORP), Pastor ImoAbasi Jacob, praised the transformation of the Ibom e-Library into a vibrant hub for entrepreneurial training, shaping of modern business mindsets, and equipping of participants with support from active alumni network to compete globally.

Similarly, the Rector of DASAC, Prof. Enoidem Usoroh, commended Governor Eno for integrating the centre's graduates into the EAP, describing the collaboration as a major boost for skills development in the State.

The event also featured the formal inauguration of the Association of Akwa Ibom Entrepreneurs, with Mr. Ime Uwah as pioneer president, and the announcement of a *10 million support grant for the body by Governor Eno.

partner government in sustaining the State's reputation as one of the most peaceful and secure in the country.

The initiative, themed, "Partnership for a Safer Akwa Ibom," was unveiled at the Banquet Hall of Government House, Uyo, on Monday, September 15.

The Governor stressed that security is pivotal to tourism and economic development, noting that his administration is committed to transforming the State into a tourism hub. He cited ongoing projects including the Arise Resorts set for commissioning in December, the International Conference Centre, Shopping Mall, Tropicana Hotel, and the International Worship Centre as major attractions that would draw visitors and investors to the State.

Governor Eno explained that the trust fund was established to guarantee long-term security infrastructure, emphasising that security is a collective responsibility of government, corporations, and

citizens. He expressed confidence that the private sector would rise to the occasion, in line with global practice, to complement government's efforts in maintaining peace and safety.

Commending security agencies for their contributions, the Governor lauded their commanders, officers, and men for ensuring that Akwa Ibom remains free from criminal strongholds. He described security management as a key component of his

ARISE Agenda, listing measures taken by his administration such as the creation of the Ministry of Internal Security and Waterways, headed by retired Brigadier General Koko Essien, and the establishment of Ibom Community Watch.

Governor Eno also acknowledged the support of past leaders who laid the foundation for peace in the State, and appreciated the State House of Assembly for passing the Security Trust Fund bill into law. He extended gratitude to the Fund's Chairman, Mr. Paul Usoro, SAN, and other stakeholders for their commitment to the success of the initiative.

The Chairman of the occasion and former Inspector General of Police, Usman Alkali, CFR, praised the Governor for translating his ARISE Agenda into actionable policies, describing him as a leader with uncommon passion for his people. He maintained that security and development are interwoven, noting that the launch of the fund provides a practical framework for sustainable peace.

The Inspector General of Police, Dr. Kayode Egbetokun, represented by the State Commissioner of Police, CP Baba Azare, described the initiative as a proactive step, stressing that security is an investment that yields long-term returns. Other speakers, including Archbishop Joseph Ekwuwem of Calabar Province, Bishop Camillus Umoh of Ikot Ekpene Diocese, and Bishop Chris Nyong, Chairman of the Christian Association of Nigeria (CAN), equally applauded Governor Eno's people-focused governance. Latter-day Saints Donates Over 440 Mobility Aids to State Govt



he Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, has donated over 263 wheelchairs and 181 assistive walking devices to the Akwa Ibom State Government, in furtherance of its humanitarian mission to support vulnerable groups and Persons Living With Disabilities (PLWDs).

Expressing appreciation to the church for its consistent demonstration of love and compassion, during the official handover ceremony on Friday, September 12, at the Women Development Centre, Uyo, Governor Umo Eno, represented by the Commissioner for Humanitarian Affairs, Hon. Emem Ibanga, noted that the gesture was not just charity, but a restored dignity, renewed hope, and reaffirmed humanity for the beneficiaries.

The Governor recalled the church's past interventions, including the donation of medical equipment during the COVID-19 pandemic, remodeling of health centres in Abak and Uyo, renovation of school blocks, and ongoing support for child nutrition and immunisation. He requested expanded collaboration in establishing a

socially inclusive ICT Hub for PLWDs, as well as increased relief and nutrition support programmes.

Quoting Matthew 9:37, Pastor Eno urged other organisations and individuals to emulate the church's example in serving humanity.

On her part, Hon. Ibanga highlighted Governor Eno's inclusive policies, which she observed have incorporated PLWDs into the State Social Register, facilitated the historic appointment of a PLWD as Permanent Secretary, and provided a *\frac{100}{2} 00 million

educational grant for students with disabilities.

Speaking on behalf of the church, Elder Alfred Kyungu, President of the Africa West Area, explained that all humanitarian efforts are funded by voluntary donations from members across the world. He stressed that the partnership extend beyond donations, as the church had trained staff of the Ministry of Women Affairs and Social Welfare in the assessment, fitting, and maintenance of the mobility devices.

In her remarks, the Delivery Advisor, Nigeria for Women Project, Dr. Ini Adiakpan, averred that the assistive devices would help PLWDs overcome barriers of accessibility, inclusivity, and equal opportunity. She added that the partnership revealed new possibilities such as customizing wheelchairs to meet specific needs, thereby enhancing independence and visibility for persons with disabilities.

The Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Humanitarian Affairs, Mrs. Eno Akpan, and other speakers commended the collaboration between the church and the government, stressing that the donation would restore independence to beneficiaries.

Ms. Joy Ubong, who spoke on behalf of the beneficiaries, thanked the Governor for amplifying the voices of PWDs and appreciated the church for complementing government's efforts with a gesture she described, as love in action.

The event featured goodwill messages from senior government officials, professional associations, and stakeholders, including leaders of the Joint National Association of Persons Living With Disabilities and the Nigeria Union of Journalists. The highlight was the formal handover and presentation of the wheelchairs and assistive devices to the beneficiaries.





HMB Reaffirms Commitment to Effective Healthcare Delivery



he Akwa Ibom State Hospitals Management Board (HMB), has reiterated its commitment to strengthening healthcare systems and ensuring improved service delivery across hospitals in the State.

The reassurance was given during an unscheduled visit to the General Hospital, Awa, and the General Hospital, Etinan, where officials assessed the state of facilities and staff performance.

Speaking on behalf of the Permanent Secretary of the Board, Dr. Abraham Inyangudoh, the Director

of Inspectorate, Dr. Imoh Akah, commended the management of the General Hospital, Awa, for maintaining a clean and orderly environment, particularly in the Accident and Emergency Unit.

The inspection, which forms part of ongoing efforts to rebrand the State's health sector, was undertaken by a team of senior directors from various departments of the Board, who pledged sustained oversight to ensure accountability and quality patient care across State-owned hospitals.

MOE Insists on Standardised Education, Shuts Down Unauthorised Schools in A'Ibom



he Ministry of Education, has intensified its drive towards quality education by shutting down several private schools operating without official authorisation.

The action, according to the ministry, aims to enforce compliance with approved standards and eliminate substandard institutions that endanger the future of Akwa Ibom children.

Leading the enforcement exercise on Monday, September 15, the Commissioner for Education, Prof. Ubong Umoh, accompanied by the Permanent Secretary, Directors, Zonal Directors, the Special Assistant on Education Monitoring, and Local Government Supervisors of Education, carried out the closure of affected schools across Uyo and Nsit Ibom Local Government Areas.

Prof. Umoh condemned the operation of schools without the Ministry's Authority to Operate (ATO), describing it as unacceptable. He decried the disturbing trend of makeshift structures such as abandoned buildings, uncompleted houses, town halls, poultry farms, lock-up shops, filling stations, church halls, and residential apartments being converted into schools, thereby putting learners at risk.

The Commissioner further expressed dismay at the practice of proprietors exceeding their licenses by expanding from nursery sections to primary and secondary levels without due approval. He highlighted shocking discoveries during the inspection, including multiple classes sharing one blackboard, cramped and partitioned classrooms, poorly ventilated spaces constructed on septic tanks, and generally deplorable sanitary conditions.

He therefore urged all proprietors of private nursery, primary, and secondary schools operating without approval to immediately regularise their status by completing proper documentation and registration with the Ministry of Education. Such steps as observed by the Commissioner are crucial to safeguard educational standards and protect children from hazardous learning environments.

A strong advisory, was also issued to parents and guardians across both urban and rural areas not to enroll their wards in unregistered schools, as Prof. Umoh reiterated that a comprehensive state-wide enforcement exercise will be undertaken in the new school year to seal unauthorised schools in the overall interest of quality education and the safety of children in the State.

Schools shutdown during the exercise included, Gracious Steps Royal Academy; Toppers Academy; Houston International Schools; Purple Hills Schools; Sparkling Height Schools; Beloved Child of God International School; Glorious Future Academy; Spring Success International School and Marcus Garvey Drillers Foundation Schools, among others. Additionally, Good Shepherd Christian Academy was directed to shut its secondary section and restrict operations to the nursery and primary levels.





Women Affairs Ministry Takes Campaign Against GBV to Ika

s part of ongoing efforts to eliminate all forms of violence against women, girls, and vulnerable persons, the Akwa Ibom State Government, through the Ministry of Women Affairs and Social Welfare, in collaboration with UN Women and with support from the Ford Foundation, has taken its campaign against Gender-Based Violence (GBV) to Ika Local Government Area.

The event, which held at the Council Secretariat in Urua Inyang, had in attendance the Chairman of Ika, Hon. Utibe Nwoko, his wife, Mrs. Idongesit

Nwoko, and other stakeholders of the local government council who warmly received the ministry's delegation.

Speaking, the Commissioner for Women Affairs and Social Welfare, Hon. Inibehe Etukudo, represented by the Director of Economic Services in the Ministry, Barr. Nkechi Udoh, described the campaign as a bold step towards building a safer and just society for women and girls in Ika. She emphasised that violence against women and girls constitutes a grave human rights violation that undermines their dignity and potential.

Hon. Etukudo highlighted the crucial roles of traditional and religious institutions in shaping societal norms, and called for stronger collaboration with government to stem the tide of GBV. According to her, their influence can help transform harmful attitudes and behaviors while providing protection and support for survivors, promoting gender equality, and advancing women's empowerment. She expressed appreciation to Governor Umo Eno for his consistent support and also commended the Ika Council Chairman for his commitment to the exercise.

In his remarks, Hon. Nwoko stressed that gender based violence is not only a crime against women and girls, but also an offense against God and humanity. He warned that with the public declaration now adopted in Ika, perpetrators of such acts would face the full



weight of the law.

The Programme Officer of UN Women, Mr. Nurudeen Ibrahim, conducted a sensitisation session to set the tone of the campaign, assisted by Ms. Adeola Potts-Johnson from the Women at Risk International Foundation (WARIF). They educated community members on the urgent need to collectively fight against GBV.

The Paramount Ruler of Ika, HRM, Edidem Ekot, represented by His Highness, Obong Jonathan Ukpongette, the Clan Head of Achan, reaffirmed the traditional institution's commitment to safeguarding the dignity of women and girls. He outlined abolished practices including sexual and gender-based violence in all forms, early marriage, female genital mutilation, wife inheritance, female disinheritance, outrageous bride price, and other harmful traditions that undermine women's rights.

Goodwill messages from development partners, including UN Women, the Excellence Community Welfare Scheme (ECEWS), and WARIF, condemned all forms of GBV and pledged continued partnership in the campaign. To formally seal the resolve, an official signing of the Public Declaration was undertaken by the Ika Council Chairman, the representative of the Traditional Ruler's Council, the Ministry of Women Affairs and Social Welfare, UN Women, and WARIF.



AKSG Poised to Align with FG Rail Initiative



he Akwa Ibom State Government, has expressed willingness to align with the Federal Government's railway expansion programme as part of efforts to attract investments, stimulate economic growth, and fast-track development in the State.

The commitment was reaffirmed by the Delivery Advisor to Governor Umo Eno on Transport, Mr. Orman Esin, who represented him at the 2nd International Railway Conference and Expo 2025, organised by the Federal Ministry of Transportation in collaboration with De Sadel Consortium on Tuesday, September 16, at the Ladi Kwali Hall, Abuja Continental Hotel.

Speaking to reporters in Abuja, Mr. Esin underscored transportation as one of the central pillars of Governor Eno's administration. He explained that rail connectivity remains critical for driving development in Akwa Ibom, particularly in positioning the State as an emerging tourism and industrial hub.

Also speaking at the event, the Commissioner for Transport, Dr. Anthony Luke, highlighted the State government's ongoing efforts under the ARISE Agenda to strengthen transportation and infrastructure. He noted progress in road expansion, the Ibaka Deep Seaport project, plans for stable power supply, and other complementary projects aimed at ensuring seamless connectivity.

Dr. Luke reiterated Governor Eno's resolve to build a sustainable, affordable, and safe transportation system for Akwa Ibom people, stressing that the administration had already initiated strategic actions to actualise this vision but requires strong collaboration with the Federal Government to accelerate railway development.

At the conference, the Managing Director of the Nigerian Railway Corporation (NRC), Dr. Kayode Opeifa, unveiled plans for high-speed rail expansion across Nigeria. The modernisation project, he explained, will reduce travel times, ease road congestion, enhance trade, and boost industrialisation. He added that the initiative seeks to connect key economic corridors, including Lagos-Kano and Abuja-Port Harcourt, while extending access to underserved regions.

The Minister for Transportation, Sa'idu Alkali, reinforced the Federal Government's commitment, noting that the NRC's modernisation drive is central to Nigeria's ambition of becoming a leading regional trade hub. Similarly, the Chief Executive Director of De Sadel Consortium, Mr. Samuel Uko, announced that the proposed 4,000km high-speed rail network will make Nigeria the second-largest in the world after China. He emphasised that extending the network to Akwa Ibom would revolutionise mobility, reducing short-distance travel to under 30 minutes.

The Akwa Ibom delegation at the conference included TPL Aniekan Akpan, Permanent Secretary, Akwa Ibom State Liaison Office, Abuja; Hon. Bassey Abia, former Member, House of Representatives for Eket Federal Constituency; Hon. Nsidibe Akata, Member representing Eket State Constituency; Hon. Akan Tommey, Chairman of Eket Local Government Area; Hon. Ayang Ayang, former representative of Eket State Constituency; and Rt. Hon. David Lawrence. The State's participation reflected a clear intent to tap into opportunities for Public-Private Partnerships (PPPs) and other financing models that will advance railway and transportation development in Akwa Ibom.


