## Tree Crop Revolution Set for November Launch as Gov Eno Visits AKADEP

·Directs agency to operate under SSG's office

the State Government (SSG).

He also ordered an immediate overhaul and remodeling of the existing infrastructure within the facility to ensure it meets the operational needs of the forthcoming agricultural initiative.

The Tree Crop Revolution, earlier announced by the Governor, will be managed by the Akwa Ibom State Agriculture and Food Security Committee, chaired by Prof. Okon Ansa, a former

Commissioner for Agriculture in the State, with Prof. Trenchard Ibia, a former Agriculture Commissioner as member, among other experts.

According to Governor Eno, the programme seeks to expand palm oil cultivation using high-yield varieties, create generational wealth for rural farmers, and stimulate economic growth across the ten federal constituencies of the State.

The Governor, disclosed that the Committee will operate from the remodeled AKADEP premises, working closely with the Office of the SSG to ensure a seamless rollout of the initiative. The facility will also host a nursery for improved palm seedlings, which will be distributed to farmers across the constituencies.

Furthermore, AKADEP is mandated to deploy at least two extension workers to each of the designated farms across the ten federal constituencies, while the Agriculture and Food Security Committee will oversee the off-take of produce during harvest periods, reaffirming the administration's commitment to leveraging agriculture as a strategic driver for food security, rural development, and sustainable wealth creation in line with the ARISE Agenda.

Meanwhile, the Secretary to the State Government, Prince Enobong Uwah, has assumed an oversight of AKADEP, pledging the full cooperation of his office to ensure the revitalisation of the agency, and fast-track Governor Eno's tree crop revolution.

strategy meeting he convened with the Akwa Ibom Agricultural Development Programme (AKADEP) and the State Committee on Agriculture and Food Security at Government House, Uyo, on Thursday, October 16, the SSG said, "His Excellency has given a clear directive on the Tree Crop Revolution and expects visible results within a defined timeline. ### AKSG Moves to Upgrade College of Education, Afaha Nsit, to Akwa Ibom State University of Education

Approves key sector interventions



he Akwa Ibom State Government, has taken a major step towards strengthening teacher education and human capital development, as it approved the upgrading of the College of Education, Afaha Nsit, to the Akwa Ibom State University of Education.

Governor Umo Eno, announced the approval on Monday, October 13, during the State Executive Council (EXCO) meeting, held at Government House, Uyo. He said the decision aligns with the Human Capital Development component of the ARISE Agenda, aimed at improving the quality of education and enhancing professional standards among teachers.

As part of the resolutions reached, the Governor approved the constitution of a Special Implementation Committee to realign and update ministerial responsibilities. The committee, chaired by the Secretary to the

State Government (SSG), with the Head of Civil Service, Executive Assistant to the Governor, Attorney General and Commissioner for Justice, Solicitor-General, and the Managing Director of Akwa Ibom State Investment Corporation (AKICORP) as members, has a sixweek mandate to submit its report.

Governor Eno charged EXCO members to remain steadfast in service delivery and collaboration to ensure the full realisation of the ARISE Agenda for the overall development of the State.

In the health sector, the Council reviewed the report of the Inter-Ministerial Committee on the Implementation of the State of Emergency in the Health Sector and approved several interventions. These include, the recruitment of doctors and medical professionals, increment of special and peculiar allowances for health workers, implementation of the skipping policy

in the health sector, and the rehabilitation of selected hospitals and primary healthcare facilities across the State.



The Council also approved the commissioning of the General Hospital, Ukanafun, scheduled for November 10, as part of ongoing efforts to strengthen healthcare delivery, among others.



Additionally, the council considered and approved a memo for the Establishment of the Office of the Public Defender under the Ministry of Justice to provide free legal representation to indigent residents and ensure they receive fair treatment under the law, as well as ratified FGPC memos on various ongoing projects in the State.

### Gov Eno Revokes Illegal Land Entitlement at Tropicana Layout

overnor Umo Eno, has ordered the revocation of all illegal land allocations at the Tropicana Layout in Uyo, as part of efforts to restore order and align development in the area with the State's original master plan.

Speaking with Government House Correspondents after inspecting the designated site for the proposed ARISE Shopping City, on Tuesday, October 14, Governor Eno cautioned individuals and groups against encroaching on government lands, stressing that such actions undermine the State's long-term development goals.

"Even though the land has remained unused for years, there has been excessive encroachment. That is why I have come here to revoke every title and activity inconsistent with the original master plan," the Governor declared.

He explained that the initiative to build the ARISE Shopping City stems from his administration's commitment to expanding the State's tourism ecosystem, alongside the ongoing completion of the 5,000-seat Ibom International Convention Centre and the 200-room Ibom International Hotel.

Governor Eno reaffirmed his vision to transform



Akwa Ibom into a world-class tourism hub by harnessing and integrating diverse assets across sectors such as culture, agriculture, aviation, and hospitality into a comprehensive tourism master plan.

According to him, the ARISE Shopping City will serve as a modern commercial and leisure destination, where tourists can conveniently access accommodation, event venues, shopping outlets, and recreational facilities in one integrated location.

"We want a shopping city that hosts international brands, a place where tourists can relax, shop, and enjoy leisure without the need to travel abroad. The ARISE Shopping City will provide that same quality and experience right here in Akwa Ibom,"

he said.



The Governor Eno disclosed that the ARISE Shopping City project has a completion target of 12 months, noting that with the State's robust infrastructure and prevailing peace, Akwa Ibom is poised for a major boost in tourism investment and visitor inflow upon completion of its hospitality and recreational development.

At the event, which drew commendations from national leaders and intellectuals who praised the insightful perspectives and potential global relevance of the books,


Governor Eno observed that true development begins with leadership that listens, serves, inspires hope, and genuinely cares for the people.

he Akwa Ibom State Government, has reaffirmed its commitment to advancing sustainable energy and strengthening healthcare delivery with the official launch of the Nigeria Solar for Health Project.

The event, held on Friday, September 10, at the Ibom E-Library, Uyo, underscores the State's determination to integrate clean energy solutions into critical sectors for improved service delivery.

Speaking at the ceremony, Governor Umo Eno, represented by the Deputy Governor, Senator Akon Eyakenyi, emphasised that the initiative aligns with his administration's vision of achieving universal, reliable, and sustainable energy access

He maintained that electricity remains a critical driver of development, serving as the foundation for effective healthcare, education, security, and economic prosperity.

In his remarks, the Commissioner for Power, Hon. Iniobong Robson, expressed appreciation to Governor Eno for his leadership and interest in the growth of the power and health sectors. He assured that his ministry would work closely with relevant partners to ensure the successful implementation of the Nigeria Solar for Health Project for the benefit of Akwa Ibom people.

#### A'Ibom Poised to Become Nigeria's Medical Hub - Gov Eno

·As he declares open 65th NSP Scientific Conference, 66th AGM

overnor Umo Eno, has reaffirmed his administration's determination to transform Akwa Ibom into Nigeria's premier medical hub.

The Governor, made this known on Wednesday, October 15, in his goodwill message at the 65th Annual Scientific Conference and 66th Annual General Meeting of the Nigeria Society of Physiotherapy (NSP), held at Ibom Hall, Uyo.

Represented by the Deputy Governor, Senator Akon Eyakenyi, Governor Eno stated that his government remains fully committed to repositioning the health sector through the provision of world-

class medical infrastructure and improved welfare packages for healthcare professionals across the State.

He emphasised that the administration's strategic investments in health facilities such as the Ibom Specialist Hospital and the proposed Ibom International Hospital form part of a deliberate plan to create a vibrant medical corridor capable of reducing outbound medical tourism and attracting patients from within and outside the country.

According to the Governor, a state of emergency has been declared in the health sector to fast-track comprehensive reforms and improve the working environment for health personnel. He assured that targeted measures are being implemented to enhance the welfare, motivation, and retention of medical staff serving in State-owned healthcare institutions.

Governor Eno commended physiotherapists for their invaluable role in healthcare delivery, especially in patient





rehabilitation, mobility enhancement, and pain management. He acknowledged that the profession remains crucial to restoring functionality and quality of life for accident victims, stroke patients, and the elderly.

While calling for increased public awareness for the physiotherapy profession, the Governor encouraged young people to explore career opportunities in the field, noting that physiotherapists play an indispensable role in modern healthcare systems.

The State Chief Executive, also advised medical practitioners in public service who engage in private practice to maintain a healthy balance between both responsibilities. He cautioned that neglecting patients in public facilities violates the trust reposed in them and undermines the ethics of the medical profession.

In his remarks, the Commissioner for Health, Dr. Ekem John, highlighted Governor Eno's approval of enhanced welfare packages for health workers under the Consolidated

Medical Salary Structure (CONMESS) and the Consolidated Health Salary Structure (CONHESS). He further disclosed the ongoing renovation of eight General Hospitals across the State and the recruitment of additional medical personnel to strengthen healthcare delivery.

The event featured the presentation of awards to the Governor, Deputy Governor, and the Commissioner for Health, as well as remarks from the National President of NSP, Dr. Oyinlola Odusanya, and the State Chairman, Dr. Anyanwu Cleophas. Umanah gave the reassurance during a Peer Learning National Workshop on "Building Trust and Advancing Police Reforms" organised by the International Alert Nigeria and the UK Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office (FCDO), held at Rocharles Hotels and Suites, Uyo, on Tuesday, October 14

Represented by the Permanent Secretary in his ministry, Akparawa James Edet, the Commissioner, maintained that public safety requires collective responsibility, as security cannot be left solely in the hands of the police. "Within the security ecosystem, every one of us is a stakeholder because the police cannot do it alone," he stated, commending the organisers for choosing Akwa Ibom for the workshop at a time when the State is intensifying efforts to consolidate peace and stability.

Umanah noted that Akwa Ibom has continued to rank high among the most peaceful States in Nigeria due to the joint commitment of government and the citizens. He further lauded President Bola Tinubu's ongoing initiatives to tackle insecurity across the nation, despite challenges, and urged Nigerians at home and in the diaspora to support the Federal Government and the Inspector General of Police in securing the country's borders and communities.

Highlighting the strides of the administration, the Information Commissioner explained that Governor Eno has institutionalised several security mechanisms, including the establishment of the Ministry of Internal Security and Waterways, which collaborates closely with other security agencies. He emphasised that security is a central pillar of the

·Commissions three solar-powered boreholes, lays foundations for shopping complex

he Chairman of Ikot Ekpene Local Government Area, Hon. Aniefiok Nkom, has reaffirmed his administration's commitment to expanding access to clean water and improving infrastructure in the region.

Hon. Nkom, who made this known on Monday, October 13, while commissioning three solar-powered boreholes in Abiakpo Ikot Udo Oboro (Ward 12), Ikot Uso Udo Mbiaso (Ward 11), and Ikot Offiong (Ward 10), averred that the projects aim to tackle water scarcity and promote sustainable development at the grassroots.

The council boss also announced plans to install transformers to restore electricity in communities in need, and to extend solar-powered boreholes to other wards.

Providing an overview of the projects, the Director of Works, Arch. Nkereuwem Nya, explained that the solar-powered borehole pumps convert solar energy into electricity for water supply. He added that the shopping complex will sit on a 3,100 sqm plot and feature ample parking, 16 shops measuring 14x20 ft and 4 shops of 14x30 ft on the ground floor, as well as 18 shops of 14x23 ft and 5 shops of 14x33 ft on the first floor, with access from Umuahia Road.

Village heads, councillors, supervisors, and ward political leaders delivered goodwill messages, commending the council Chairman for his developmental strides.



## Okobo: Henshaw Approves Monthly Allowance for 66 Village Youth Presidents

h e Chairman of Okobo Local Government Area, Rt. Hon. George Henshaw, has approved the payment of monthly allowances to all 66 gazetted village youth presidents across the local government area.

Hon. Effiong who also participated in the eye screening exercise, expressed her gratitude to the medical team for their dedication to the people of Ibeno.


