(APC) and participate actively in the ongoing Continuous Voter Registration exercise, stressing that such civic engagement was necessary to secure more development and progress for the State.

"We are Akwa Ibom united, united for progress and development. And, the symbolic broom of the Party will sweep away disunity, poverty, division, and treachery," the Governor declared.

He reaffirmed his loyalty to President Bola Tinubu Akwa Ibom people. and the Senate President, Godswill Akpabio, assuring that Akwa Ibom State would stand solidly

behind their re-election in 2027. According to the Governor, "Identifying with the Federal Government is key to ensuring that the State continued to benefit from the support of the centre."

The State Chief Executive disclosed that he deliberately returned to the State at night in order to personally inspect the functionality of the newly restored runway lighting system at the Victor Attah International Airport. Expressing satisfaction with

the work done, he commended the Airport management team for meeting the set deadline and ensuring the smooth resumption of night operations.

"Our Airport is back, so any flight can now land here at night. Ibom Air can also bring in passengers and conveniently night-stop in Uyo, with the first flights to Lagos and Abuja taking off early in the morning," he announced.

Pastor Eno further lauded the Akwa Ibom State House of Assembly for the swift passage of the Supplementary Budget, noting that the approval would enable the government to extend its road network from 772km to 1000km during the coming dry season. He assured that his administration

remains focused on delivering the dividends of democracy through collaborative efforts with all tiers and arms of government.

Appreciating the overwhelming turnout at the airport, the Governor likened the gesture to "fuel in a car," stressing that it would inspire him to work harder in transforming the State. He also pledged continued service and commitment to the growth and wellbeing of Akwa lbom people.

he 2025 edition of the Ibom Ignite Conference, with the theme, "Ignite to Accelerate," has been declared opened at the Ibom-LED Centre, IBB Avenue, Uyo, with a strong call on young people to embrace innovation, resilience, and self-determination, in order to accelerate their personal and collective destinies.

Governor Umo Eno, who opened the conference on Friday, September 3, recalled its origin as a vision to uplift the youths and challenge entitlement mentality, stressing that government alone cannot define success, and urged participants to take responsibility for their future.

"Everyday, God gives you an opportunity, so as you have come today, I beg you, do not waste this opportunity. I like to talk to young people, take your destiny into your hands," the Governor advised.

In his welcome address, Pastor ImoAbasi Jacob hinted that the conference started as a youth impact programme, but has now grown into a global event, hosted at world-class venues. Calling on the participants to seize the moment, he said, "Fire without movement is wasted. Wake up the giant

inside you, because your future starts now."

In an opening charge, Rev. Godwin Amaowoh, quoting Deuteronomy 8:18 and Luke 4:6, emphasised empowerment as the key to wealth creation. Declaring the association's interest in partnering AKSHIA to facilitate the enrollment of their families and dependents in the ARISE Care Scheme, Engr. Ekiko described the initiative as a timely and people-centered programme capable of easing the burden of healthcare financing on households.

He disclosed that within just one year of

It would be recalled that in 2023, the Federal Government launched the Compressed Natural Gas (CNG) buses through the Presidential CNG Initiative to reduce fuel costs, create jobs, and promote environmental sustainability by transitioning from petrol and diesel to CNG-powered vehicles.

or better accessibility and patronage, the Akwa Ibom State Government has relocated the site of the CNG bus terminal from Odiok Itam in Itu Local Government Area to Obio Offot and Ikot Akpe communities in Uyo Local Government Area.

Speaking during an inspection of the site, Pastor Umo Eno, noted that the decision to relocate the terminal, after much consideration, was to ensure better accessibility for residents of the State.

Pastor Eno disclosed that the terminal would consist of a gas station, training school, repairs workshop for engineers, CNG technology and a maintenance unit.

The Governor, who commended the host community for cooperation in ensuring the success of the project, urged youths in the area to participate in the construction and protection of the facility from

To ensure that Akwa Ibom people benefit from the initiative, the State government, through the Ministry of Transportation in collaboration with the Central Bank of Nigeria, ordered 50 CNG buses to improve transportation in the State.

VAIA: Gov Eno Commends NAMA, Ibom Airport Devt Company for Restoring Night Operations

· Reaffirms commitment to sustained investment in aviation sector



he State Governor, Pastor Umo Eno, has commended the Nigerian Airspace Management Agency (NAMA) and the Ibom Airport Development Company (IADC), for the successful restoration of night flight operations at the Victor Attah International Airport (VAIA), following the September 30, ultimatum.

Last week, Governor Eno, had issued a directive to the Senior Special Assistant/Managing Director and Chief Executive Officer of IADC, Mr. Uwem Ekanem, alongside the Board, to ensure the full restoration of the airfield lighting system on or before September 30. The task, he noted, has now been completed within the specified timeline.

According to a release by the Chief Press Secretary to the Governor, Mr. Ekerete Udoh, Pastor Eno congratulated the MD/CEO, the staff, and the Board of IADC for rising to the challenge, adding that the calibration and overhaul of the airport's navigational aids, coupled with the restoration of the lighting systems, putting an end to the sunrise-to-sunset operational restriction. He confirmed that night flight operations have now resumed with immediate effect.

The Governor also expressed deep appreciation to NAMA for its critical role in ensuring the successful completion of the project. He reaffirmed the government's commitment to sustained investments in the State's aviation infrastructure, including the Maintenance, Repair and Overhaul (MRO) facility, the international terminal, and other ongoing projects, all of which are targeted for operational readiness ahead of the Yuletide season.

Highlighting the tourism focal sector of the ARISE Agenda, Governor Eno emphasised that the restoration of night operations would further boost accessibility and convenience for tourists and other visitors, especially with the planned commissioning of the ARISE Resort in December.

Described as the nation's premier family-themed resort, the facility is expected to complement Ibom Air's expanded operations and strengthen Akwa Ibom's positioning as Nigeria's emerging tourism haven.

"Akwa Ibom is being primed as the tourism hub of the nation and a future secured with or without oil," the Governor stated.

AKHA: 2025 Supplementary Budget Scales Second Reading



he 2025 Supplementary Appropriation Bill, totaling N695 billion, has passed second reading on the floor of the Akwa Ibom State House of Assembly.

The bill, transmitted by Governor Umo Eno, was conveyed in a letter, read by the Clerk of the House, Mrs. Nsikak-Abasi Orok, during plenary on Tuesday, September 30.

The House Leader, Rt. Hon. Otobong Bob, moved the motion for the consideration of the bill, seconded by the Deputy Leader, Hon. Nsidibe Akata. The bill was read for the first time and

immediately taken through second reading, during which lawmakers debated its general principles.

With the augmentation, the total budget size for 2025 now stands at N1.650 trillion, comprising N125.664 billion for recurrent expenditure and N569.335 billion for capital expenditure, in addition to the original appropriation of N955 billion.

The Speaker, Rt. Hon. Udeme Otong, referred the bill to the House Committee on Finance and Appropriation for further legislative work, with a report expected on Tuesday, October 7.

In a related development, the House also received a letter from Governor Eno seeking approval for an adjustment of the 2025–2027 Medium Term Expenditure Framework (MTEF) to reflect recent changes in fiscal indicators.

The Governor requested the House to approve a new total revenue projection (including the opening balance) of N1.7 trillion, as against the previous provision of N980 billion, noting that the positive shift in fiscal indicators necessitated the supplementary budget.

The Speaker, referred the request to the House Committee on Economic Planning for consideration and directed the committee to report back to the House at the earliest possible date.

embers of the 8th Assembly, have been welcomed back after 51 days working recess, with a charge to renew dedication to the mandate entrusted by their constituents.



o further advance public safety and ensure the wellbeing of Akwa Ibom people, the Commissioner for Information, Rt. Hon. Aniekan Umanah has reaffirmed the ministry's readiness to deepen collaboration with the State sector Command of the Federal Road Safety Corps (FRSC).

Drawing from his experience as a former member of the House of Representatives Committee overseeing the FRSC, Umanah commended the Corps for their proactive efforts and urged the Sector Command to deploy necessary testing equipment on the roads to check drug-impaired driving.

He further highlighted the achievements of Governor Umo Eno's administration under the

ARISE Agenda, averring that the government's focused approach and methodical implementation of its development blueprint, have yielded significant results in infrastructure and service delivery over the past two years.

On his part, the Sector Commander, Corps Commander Francis A. Ajata, who assumed duties in the State in June, highlighted the importance of strengthening existing partnerships between the FRSC and key

The ceremony also drew political leaders, traditional rulers, stakeholders, and community representatives, reflecting widespread support for the chairman's people-oriented policies.






How Gov Eno Turned Power Talk to Energy Action

or years, Akwa Ibom has lived in paradox: a state rich in hydrocarbons and gas reserves, home to Ibom Power Plant, yet struggled to guarantee its people steady electricity.

Until recently, however, States had little room to chart their own course. Power was tightly held at the federal level, leaving sub-nationals with vision but no authority. That changed with the Electricity Act of 2023, which finally opened the door for States to take control of their own electricity futures.

days. Their presence underscored that the electricity reform drive is not just the Governor's agenda, but a shared government mandate. At the close of deliberations, the Secretary to the State Government, Prince Enobong Uwah, read the Communiqué, which captured in detail the resolutions, timelines, and commitments arising from the historic engagement.

Senator Ekong Sampson, speaking for Akwa Ibom stakeholders, pledged legislative backing, while the Governor touched hearts by acknowledging Ms. Ekemini Umoh, an Akwa Ibom daughter who flew in from Europe to contribute to the deliberations.

Still, many seasoned voices at the summit sounded a note of caution. They reminded participants that in Nigeria, the electricity game has long been 90 percent politics and only 10 percent real commitment. For reforms to succeed, therefore, the political will must endure beyond declarations, while technical and financial discipline remain non-negotiable.

Yet vision must wrestle with reality. 2034 is a decade away. Skepticism is natural in a country where projects rarely outlive the administrations that birth them. This is why the Governor has also set short-term deliverables: rehabilitation of Ibom Power, rollout of the electrification plan, licensing of new players, enforcement of consumer rights—all within two years.

Electricity is not grammar. It is light in sockets, machines humming in factories, cold rooms running without diesel, children studying without smoke stinging their eyes.

What makes Eno's approach distinct is his tone. He insists recruitment will be professional, free of political patronage. He frames reforms as partnerships, not decrees—drawing in the federal government, investors, and international partners. That sincerity may explain why the summit drew such broad participation and endorsements.

But sincerity alone will not power homes. Competence, ruthless accountability, and citizen responsibility will. Infrastructure must be protected from vandalism, tariffs must be fair but paid, and providers must deliver on their promises. The Governor is right: government cannot do it alone.

For now, a candle has been lit in Akwa Ibom. How it grows into steady flame will depend on the next 24 months. If milestones are met, the dream of 2034 may indeed come within reach. If they are missed, hope will dim, and the paradox will remain.

The people of Akwa Ibom deserve more than promises. They deserve power—steady, affordable, and fair. And as the Governor himself said, only when the state is truly electrified will Akwa Ibom rise and stand tall together, no longer in shadow but in light fulfilled.

When the milestones of today mature into the power lines of tomorrow, then Akwa Ibom will not just rise, it will shine.

Governor Eno is determined to seize that chance. In the week leading to the Summit, he personally joined stakeholders at the Rural Electrification Agency (REA) Roundtable in Abuja, where Akwa Ibom signed a landmark Memorandum of Understanding on renewable energy penetration, a step that underscored his commitment to blending vision with concrete action.

At the maiden Akwa Ibom Electricity Summit held at Four Points by Sheraton, Ikot Ekpene, with the theme "Attaining Energy Security and Universal Access for Akwa Ibom State within the Framework of the Nigerian Electricity Supply Industry," he lifted a promise as bold as sunrise: by 2034, every household in the state will enjoy reliable electricity.

"We are blessed with gas, and we have a power plant, yet our people still live with epileptic supply," the Governor told the gathering. "These are hard questions, but we must dare to ask them. And we must act."

The reforms he announced are sweeping. A State Electricity Regulatory Commission will be created to ensure fair tariffs and transparent licensing. An Electrification Agency will extend supply to communities too long left in darkness. Ibom Power, long underperforming, is to be rehabilitated and commercialised. A state distribution company will be born. Citizens will be protected by a Consumer Bill of Rights. And not less than 20 percent of future supply will come from clean energy sources—solar farms, renewables, electric buses, and compressed natural gas.

Gov. Eno's electricity development pursuit in the State is not a flight-bynight initiative. It is firmly embedded in Aspiration 3 of the ARISE Agenda, which clearly sets out "to ensure the provision of uninterrupted electricity supply to homes, businesses, and industries in the State." The Summit therefore represents not just policy talk, but the translation of a campaign blueprint into a governance framework.

The plan is the most comprehensive electricity reform yet attempted by a Nigerian sub-national. It dares to take power out of the stranglehold of a federal monopoly and bring it closer to the people. It seeks not just to light homes, but to electrify factories, power schools, energize hospitals, and make businesses less dependent on noisy, costly diesel generators.

The summit itself drew an impressive constellation of voices. The Deputy Governor, Senator Akon Eyakenyi, who chaired the State's Electricity Summit Committee, set the tone in her welcome, urging participants not to "talk for talk's sake," but to align politics, policy, and investment with technical and financial reforms.

The Federal Government, represented by the Minister of Power, Chief Adebayo Adelabu, through his Chief Technical Adviser, Mr. Adedayo Olowoniyi, pledged support. The Speaker of the House of Representatives, Rt. Hon. Abbas Tajudeen, represented by the Chairman, House Committee on Power, Hon. Victor Nwokolo, hailed Governor Eno's courage and foresight.

There were also Commissioners representing the Governors of Enugu,
