## President Tinubu Hails Gov Eno's Transformative Leadership at Funeral of CBN Dep Gov's Mother

• Condoles daughter, Emem Usoro • As Gov Eno rallies support for Tinubu, Akpabio, self ahead of 2027





igeria's President, Bola Tinubu, has extolled the visionary and impactful leadership of the State Governor, Pastor Umo Eno, describing him as a man of humility, unity, and purpose-driven governance.

President Tinubu made the commendation on Saturday, October 25, during a reception, held at Four Points by Sheraton Hotel, Ikot Ekpene, after the funeral of late Deaconess Eno Usoro, mother of the Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN) Deputy Governor (Operations), Mrs. Emem Usoro.

# Gov Eno Launches ARISE Youth Hubs to Boost Skills, Job Creation in A'Ibom

·Kicks off initiative in 11 pilot LGAs, expands to 31 by May 2026





n a strategic move to empower young people and tackle unemployment in the State, Governor Umo Eno, has flagged off the construction of Youth-Friendly Hubs in 11 local government areas.

The initiative, designed to promote innovation, creativity and entrepreneurship among the youths, serving as a cornerstone of the administration's broader agenda for inclusive economic growth, was launched simultaneously on Tuesday, October 21, at Etinan, Mkpat Enin, Urue Offong/Oruko, Uruan, Itu, Etim Ekpo, Nsit Atai, Nsit Ubium, Eastern Obolo, Oron, and Ikono.

Represented by members of the State Executive Council at the various flag-off centres, Governor Eno described the initiative as a new era of innovation and inclusive development, which reflects his administration's commitment to creating sustainable opportunities rather than offering handouts.

He emphasised that the hubs are conceived as safe, enabling spaces that will equip young Akwa Ibom people with practical skills, digital competence, and the confidence to thrive in a global economy.

"These are not just buildings, they are innovation centers and platforms for creativity, collaboration, and growth, spaces where young people can shape their own success stories and contribute meaningfully to our collective development," the Governor said.

Each of the ARISE Youth Hubs, as stated by Governor Eno, will feature a multi-sectoral training center offering modular skill programmes, a startup accelerator and incubation unit, coworking areas to foster teamwork, and recreational lounges

to promote social interaction and mental well-being. Additional components include, a creative development hub for arts and culture, an ICT innovation lab, a networking café, and a digital e-library to enhance research and global learning.

Disclosing that the construction of 20 additional hubs will commence in January 2026, with the vision of completing one fully functional hub in each of the 31 local government areas before May 2026, the State Chief Executive averred that the initiative follows a modular incubation model consistent with global best practices, positioning the hubs as centers of excellence for youth development and innovation.

He, therefore, called on young people across the State to take ownership of the project, stressing that the true success of the Hubs will depend on how effectively they utilise the facilities to innovate, collaborate, and create value. "The success of these hubs will not be measured by their structures," he said, "but by the ideas, products, and enterprises that emerge from them."

The Governor also commended the local government chairmen, community leaders, development partners, and other stakeholders for their support and partnership, noting that their collaboration remains critical to the sustainability of the initiative.

With construction already underway in the eleven pilot locations, the ARISE Youth Hubs Initiative stands as a defining milestone in Akwa Ibom's developmental journey, reaffirming the Governor's belief in the creativity, resilience, and limitless potential of the youths.

# Gov Eno Reaffirms Commitment to Quality Education at Topfaith Graduation Ourges graduands on excellence Faculties of Computing and Applied Sciences, and that of



overnor Umo Eno, has reaffirmed commitment to promote quality education as cornerstone for sustainable development across the State.

Governor Eno, who stated this on Friday, October 17, during the maiden convocation of Topfaith University, at Mkpatak, in Essien Udim Local Government Area, lauded the institution's rapid progress and described it as a beacon of academic innovation and growth within just four years of establishment.

Represented by the Deputy Governor, Senator Akon Eyakenyi, Governor Eno commended the management for its impressive expansion to five faculties and 26 departments since obtaining its license in 2021 as the third private university in Akwa Ibom State. He congratulated the staff and students on the successful convocation. He also charged the new graduates to uphold excellence and integrity in all their pursuits.

In his address, the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Patrick Ebewo, described the ceremony as a significant milestone in the institution's pursuit of academic distinction, and disclosed that the university began academic activities in 2021 with 104 students, out of which 40 are graduating from the

Management and Social Sciences. He added that students from the Faculties of Law and Engineering, which run fiveyear programmes, will graduate next year.

Highlighting the institution's steady progress, Prof. Ebewo further announced that the National Universities Commission (NUC), has granted approval for the commencement of Medicine and Surgery (MBBS) and Cybersecurity programmes beginning from the 2025/2026 academic session. This, he said, reflects the university's dedication to expanding academic opportunities and aligning with modern global educational standards.

The Founder and Chairman, Board of Trustees, Dr. Emmanuel Abraham, congratulated the graduating students for their outstanding performance and urged them to uphold the values of diligence and discipline inculcated during their studies. He expressed gratitude to Governor Umo Eno and past administrations for their "extremely



education-friendly disposition," and appreciated the governing council, parents, and other stakeholders for their support of the university's pioneering vision. Dr. Abraham further assured that Topfaith University would continue to pursue cutting-edge research, exchange programmes, and collaborations in line with global best practices.

Delivering the convocation lecture on the theme, "Repositioning University Education for Human Empowerment in an Emerging World," Prof. Joy Eyisi emphasised the need for education to evolve beyond traditional teaching models to remain relevant in a rapidly changing world.

A total of 40 students graduated, with 11 earning First Class Honours, 16 Second Class Upper, nine Second Class Lower, three Third Class, and one Pass, while Miss Marylyn Ibem emerged the Best Graduating Student.



# AKHA Commits to Citizens' Welfare, Legislative Progress in Third Year

·Outlines two years achievements


he Akwa Ibom State House of Assembly, has reaffirmed its commitment to advancing citizens' welfare and sustaining legislative progress as lawmakers commence the third legislative year.

The Assembly also assured that it will prioritise the consideration of pending petitions, strengthen committee oversight through follow-up visits, and deliberate on ongoing bills to ensure effective governance.

Speaking during a press briefing at the Assembly Complex on Thursday, October 16, the Chairman of the House Committee on Information, Hon. Jerry Otu, highlighted the achievements of the 8th Assembly in the past two years across its core mandates of lawmaking, oversight, and representation. He noted that since its inauguration in June 2023, the Assembly has received 44 bills in its first session, with 13 passed into law, while 26 bills were introduced and 12 enacted in the second session. In the ongoing third session, one bill has so far been passed out of the five presented.

Hon. Otu, who represents Ikot Ekpene/Obot Akara State Constituency, expressed satisfaction with the quality of motions presented by members to address the pressing needs of citizens and draw the attention of the executive arm to urgent matters requiring intervention. He added that the Assembly has been proactive in identifying operational lapses in some government agencies, which have since been addressed through committee investigations.

The lawmaker further disclosed that the House has treated numerous complaints from citizens and civil servants, ensuring fair hearings and timely resolutions in several cases. He stated that matters requiring additional attention have been

recommended for further legislative action to guarantee fairness and justice.

Commending the leadership of the Speaker, Rt. Hon. Udeme Otong, Hon. Otu attributed the Assembly's harmonious working environment and legislative productivity to the Speaker's inclusive and focused leadership style. This, he said, has enabled members to discharge their duties effectively without rancour.

He reaffirmed the legislature's commitment to maintaining a cordial relationship with the media for transparent and accurate reportage of the Assembly's activities. Other lawmakers present at the briefing included Hon. Moses Essien (Ibiono Ibom), Hon. Itorobong Etim (Uruan), and Hon. Lawrence Udoide (INI).



# Lady Obareki Flags Off Integrated Management of Acute Malnutrition Centre in Etinan

· Receives nutrition champion recognition



he Coordinator, Office of the First Lady, Lady Helen Obareki, has flagged off the Integrated Management of Acute Malnutrition (IMAM) Out-Patient Therapeutic Programme (OTP) at the Primary Health Care Operational Base in Etinan Local Government Area, to tackle the rising incidence of acute malnutrition among children under five years.

Speaking on Monday, October 20, at the IMAM project, jointly undertaken by the Federal Ministry of Health and Social Welfare, the Akwa Ibom State Ministry of Health, and the Akwa Ibom State Primary Health Care Development Agency, as well as the Helen Keller International, Lady Obareki stressed that the initiative was in tandem with the ARISE Agenda of Governor Umo Eno, which identifies maternal and child health as a critical pillar of the State's development plan.

The Coordinator explained that the initiative also supports the Maternal and Child Healthcare thematic area of the Golden Initiative for All (GIFA), aimed at ensuring that every mother and child in Akwa Ibom receives optimal care from conception through early childhood. She further described the IMAM programme as a vital transition from policy to practical life-saving action, that provides specialised care for screening, diagnosis, and treatment of malnourished children.

While commending Helen Keller International and the Ministries of Health at both federal and state levels for their technical and logistical support, Lady Obareki lauded health workers for their commitment, describing them as "frontline heroes." She reaffirmed the commitment of the First Lady's office and GIFA to fight against malnutrition, assuring that partnerships with development agencies and health stakeholders will continue to ensure that every child in Akwa Ibom grows healthy and well-nourished.

Speaking on behalf of the Deputy Governor, Senator Akon Eyakenyi, the Permanent Secretary in her office, Mr. Joseph Esidem noted that the establishment of the IMAM centre reflects the government's continued commitment to child health and the wellbeing of vulnerable populations. He added that the State government, under the ARISE Agenda, has continued to provide standard health facilities, expand access to quality healthcare services, and recruit more health professionals, especially to meet the needs of rural communities.

At the event, which featured remarks from the representatives of the Country Director of Helen Keller International, the Federal Ministry of Health and Social Welfare, the National and State Primary Health Care Development Agencies and the Chairman of Etinan LGA, Lady Obareki was honoured as a Nutrition Champion by the Federal and State Ministries of Health, in recognition of her exceptional advocacy and leadership in promoting maternal and child nutrition in Akwa Ibom State.

# CAHSEL Applauds Gov Eno's Approval of Allowances, Incentives for Healthcare Practitioners

he Coalition of All Health Sector Leaders (CAHSEL) in the State, has applauded Governor Umo Eno's efforts in repositioning the health sector through the recent approval of allowances and incentives for healthcare practitioners.

Briefing journalists on Monday, October 20, at the Doctor's Mess, Udo Udoma Avenue, Uyo, the Chairman of CAHSEL, Dr. Aniekan Peter said the approvals will go a long way to improve the quality of health care services in the State, and enhance the well being of citizens.

Maintaining that the new allowances by the Governor, would not only serve as a morale booster for the health workers, but also retain skilled professionals in the field, reverse the 'JAPA' syndrome and increase the overall productivity in health care.

The CAHSEL Chairman further listed Revolution in the primary healthcare, Akwa Ibom Health Insurance Agency, Akwa Ibom State Emergency Medical Service and Ambulance System (AKISEMSAS), Construction of Oxygen plants, Construction of new General Hospital at Ukanafun, Renovation of Accident and Emergency Unit at the Ikot Ekpene General Hospital, Establishment of Renal Centre at Ikot Ekpene, Renovation and Upgrading of the Ibom Airport Clinic, recent Declaration of State of

Emergency in the Health Sector and the recent approval for renovation of eight General Hospitals and 25 Comprehensive Health and primary health centres, as part of Governor Eno's reforms in the sector under the ARISE Agenda.

He also appreciated the Governor for the approval of the ongoing recruitment of 2,000 new health professionals, ongoing recruitment of 900 retired workers on contract, approval for skipping policy, payment of MRTF, revitalisation of the State Molecular diagnostic Laboratories and the introduction of four new allowances as incentives including, health sector peculiar allowance, retention

allowance, teaching <sup>6</sup> allowance, Accoutrement and rural allowance, as well as review of all Health laws.

Pledging CAHSEL's commitment to the growth of the sector, Dr. Peter assured that the body will support the State government in sensitising health workers on attitudinal change, empathy, resilience and dedication to service, as well as galvanise support for the actualisation of the Ibom International Hospital and the Ibom Medical University.

Giving a vote of thanks at the briefing that featured interaction with journalists, the NUJ State Chairman, Comrade Nsibiet John, thanked the coalition for partnering with the media to showcase the strides of Governor Eno in the health sector.

Represented by the State Secretary, Comrade Nsikak Esenowo, Comrade John assured of deepened partnership with the body for proper sensitisation of the government activities and programmes in the sector.





### Ministry of Health Hosts House of Reps Committee on Healthcare Services · Highlights Gov Eno's strides in the sector



embers of the House of Representatives Committee on Healthcare Services, were in the State on Friday, October 17, as part of their oversight function to assess progress in healthcare delivery.

Hosted by the State Ministry of Health at its conference room in Uyo, the Commissioner for Health, Dr. Ekem John, who welcomed the delegation, said the visit aligned with Governor Umo Eno's administration's commitment to providing accessible, affordable, and quality healthcare services through the remodeling and equipping of Primary Health Centres (PHCs) and the establishment of the Akwa Ibom State Health Insurance Agency (AKSHIA).

Dr. John, applauded the Committee for its collaborative efforts towards strengthening healthcare delivery in the country. He reaffirmed the State government's dedication to ensuring that citizens, particularly those in rural areas,

enjoy improved access to quality medical care. He also disclosed that discussions are ongoing between the ALGON Chairman and the State government for all Local Government Councils to pool resources into the Basic Healthcare Provision Fund (BHCPF) to match the State's contributory funding and strengthen primary healthcare operations.

The Commissioner, further announced the approval for the recruitment of 2,000 new health workers by Governor Umo Eno, and the re-engagement of medically fit retirees on contract to boost the healthcare workforce. He explained that the strategy will balance experience and innovation within the system, improving efficiency and service delivery across healthcare facilities statewide.

Revealing that during the last State Executive Council meeting, the salary structure of all health workers was reviewed including, new allowances for both CONHESS and CONMESS cadres, Dr. John noted that the implementation of the new structure will make Akwa Ibom's health professionals the highest-paid in the country by November 2025, reflecting the Governor's commitment to staff welfare and retention of skilled manpower in the health sector.

In his remarks, the Chairman of the House Committee on Healthcare Services, Hon. Amos Magaji, lauded Governor Eno and the ministry for their remarkable strides in transforming healthcare delivery in Akwa Ibom. He emphasised the Federal Government's determination to ensure that every Nigerian, particularly those in rural communities, has access to basic healthcare. Dr. Magaji also urged effective resource management following the exit of major donor agencies, stressing the need to sustain gains and prevent avoidable deaths from treatable conditions.

The Committee received detailed reports from the Executive Secretary, Akwa Ibom State Primary Healthcare Development Agency (AKSPHCDA), Dr. Eno Attah, on the performance and challenges of the Basic Healthcare Provision Fund in the State. It also reviewed a PowerPoint presentation from the Permanent Secretary, Akwa Ibom State Health Insurance Agency (AKSHIA), Dr. Igbemi Igbemi, outlining the State's progress towards achieving Universal Health Coverage (UHC) and its ongoing efforts to expand access to quality healthcare through strategic insurance programmes.





# 329 Contractors Jostle for 2024 UBE Intervention Projects as SUBEB/UBEC Open Bids

he State Universal Basic Education Board (SUBEB), in collaboration with the Universal Basic Education Commission (UBEC), has officially opened bids for the execution of the 2024 UBE intervention projects.

Addressing the gathering, on Monday, October 20, at the board's Headquarters, Idongesit Nkanga Secretariat, Uyo, the Executive Chairman of SUBEB, Rt. Hon. Anietie Etuk, described the event as a collective stride towards improving the learning environment for pupils and teachers across the State. He stressed that the bidding process aligns strictly with the Public Procurement Act of 2007, ensuring transparency, fairness, and competitiveness.

Etuk further explained that the bidding process goes beyond mere formality, describing it as a demonstration of good governance and accountability in the utilisation of public funds. He added that the projects will cover construction, reconstruction, renovation, and supply of school furniture and learning materials, urging only competent and reputable contractors with proven integrity to participate.

The SUBEB Chairman noted that all approved projects are expected to be completed within a three-month timeframe, urging successful contractors to take advantage of the dry season to ensure timely delivery and uphold the highest ethical and professional standards. He also commended Governor Umo Eno, for his consistent support of basic education through the prompt payment of counterpart funding, which has sustained the implementation of UBE projects in the State.



In her remarks, the Permanent Secretary of SUBEB, Mrs. Roseline Mfon, appealed for cooperation from host communities to facilitate smooth project execution. She advised contractors to prioritise quality delivery and strictly avoid the use of substandard materials, reiterating the government's commitment to ensuring lasting educational infrastructure across schools in Akwa Ibom.

Speaking on behalf of UBEC, the South-South Zonal Representative, Mr. Francis Etuk, commended Akwa Ibom State for being one of the few States consistently meeting counterpart funding obligations. He stressed the importance of quality assurance and timely completion of all awarded projects, wishing the Board and contractors a successful bidding exercise.



The highlight of the event was the formal opening of the tender box, accreditation, and inspection of bids led by the Project Officer, Nsikak-Abasi Ossom, with Builder Jacob Umana overseeing the counting, reading, and recording process. A total of 329 bids were submitted for consideration, while only 134 projects were available for award.

Representatives from ICPC, NLC, BPP, NUJ, and the Ministry of Justice delivered goodwill messages, urging contractors to maintain high standard and utilise quality materials throughout the construction process.
