driven, and technology-oriented employment process in Akwa Ibom.

Speaking during an inspection of the CBT Centre at the Idongesit Nkanta Secretariat on Friday, October 10, Governor Eno expressed satisfaction with the facility's readiness for the exercise. He disclosed that the centre, which can accommodate up to 2,000 candidates daily, will serve as the hub for the digitised aptitude test designed to select qualified applicants into the state civil service.

Explaining that the adoption of CBT technology is in line with global best practices and the administration's vision to uphold merit and

eliminate undue influence in recruitment, the Governor said, "The civil service is the engine room of governance. The quality of people we bring into the system matters. The world has moved to AI now, so we need individuals who can operate in a digital environment. This process will also eradicate godfatherism and ensure that only those who merit it gain employment."

The Head of Service, Elder Effiong Essien, who was part of the inspection team, commended

Governor Enofor institutionalising e-governance in Akwa Ibom. He announced that prospective candidates would have the opportunity to undertake a trial session ahead of the main examination, scheduled to hold in ten days, to ensure a smooth and fair testing experience.

The Commissioner for Science and Digital Economy, Dr. Frank Ekpenyong, also lauded the Governor's foresight, noting that the CBT Centre is fully

equipped with state-of-the-art facilities capable of handling up to 2,000 tests daily. He emphasised that the deployment of digital technology in recruitment underscores the administration's commitment to efficiency, transparency, and inclusivity.

Pastor Eno's digital recruitment initiative represents another milestone in his administration's ongoing efforts to modernise public service operations through technology. The move aligns with the ARISE Agenda's focus on governance, innovation, and peoplecentered reforms, aimed at building a productive and future-ready workforce for the State.

## Gov Eno Signs N695B Supplementary Budget, Disburses N60B for Ongoing Projects

The signing ceremony took place on Wednesday, October 8, during the October edition of the State's Project Delivery Meeting held at Government House, Uyo.

Speaking shortly after appending his signature to the budget, Governor Eno commended the Speaker and members of the House of Assembly for the swift consideration and passage of the Appropriation Bill. He reiterated his administration's commitment to transparency, accountability, and a peoplecentered approach to governance.

The Governor assured citizens that his government would continue to uphold probity and diligence in the discharge of duties for the collective good of all . "With the passage and signing of the supplementary budget today, we are further fired up to ensure the full implementation of government programmes and projects as contained in the budget," he stated.

In a move to fast-track the completion of ongoing projects, the State Chief Executive announced the release of \(\frac{1}{2}\)60 billion to contractors whose Interim Payment Certificates (IPCs) had been duly processed. He charged heads of Ministries, Departments, and Agencies (MDAs) and Delivery Advisors to ensure strict adherence to approved timelines and standards in project execution.

The October edition of the Project Delivery Meeting featured presentations on 12 key projects spanning various sectors. These included the Tree Crop Revolution, State Electricity Market, Tourism Destination Marketing, ARISE Senior Citizens Centre, ARISE Resort, Ibom Tourism Summit, renovation of

Ibom Hotels and Golf Resort, Christmas Unplugged, Oron Maritime and Jetty Project, CNG City Bus Project, AKBC House, Ikot Ekpene International Market, renovation of the House of Assembly Complex and Speaker's Lodge, Court of Appeal Complex, 10-Airport Projects, Itam Industrial Park, Equipment Leasing Company, Ibom Model Farm, RAMP Project, Ibom International Hospital, General Hospitals in Ukanafun and Ibiono Ibom, Mother and Child Hospital, and the Aviation Village.

### Ibom Int'l Hotel Project: Gov Eno Lauds Work Quality, Insists on Timely Delivery



overnor Umo Eno, has expressed satisfaction with the quality and pace of work at the ongoing Ibom International Hotel project, describing it as a world-class facility poised to meet global hospitality standards.

Designed as a 200-room premium hospitality facility, the Ibom International Hotel is strategically positioned to complement the Ibom International Convention Centre and the State's Shopping City, both envisioned to enhance Akwa Ibom's tourism and investment appeal.

## Pastor Eno Approves N27,000 Increase for A'lbom Pensioners


astor Umo Eno, has approved an increment of №27,000 for all pensioners in the State Public Service, effective September 1, 2025.

The Head of Civil Service, Elder Effiong Essien, who announced the approval in a

statement issued in Uyo recently, said the gesture followed the implementation of the new minimum wage of \text{\text{\text{\text{N}}}}80,000 and the successful conclusion of the verification exercise for pensioners in the State.

According to the statement, the latest approval underscores Governor Eno's continued commitment to the welfare of retirees and his administration's determination to ensure that senior citizens enjoy the benefits of their years of service.

Elder Essien recalled that earlier in April 2024, the Governor had approved a ₩15,000 flat-rate increase for pensioners who retired between 2007



and 2011, and ₩20,000 for those who retired before 2007, while also releasing funds monthly to defray the inherited gratuity backlog of over ₩90 billion.

He described the new pension increment as further evidence of Governor Eno's compassionate leadership and dedication to improving the living standards of pensioners in the State public service.

"These approvals by His Excellency demonstrate his administration's unwavering commitment to the welfare of pensioners and the overall wellbeing of the people of Akwa Ibom State," the Head of Civil Service affirmed.



## House of Assembly Urges State Participation in 2025 NAFEST, INAC Festivals

he Akwa Ibom State House of Assembly has called on the State government to facilitate the participation of Akwa Ibom contingents in the 2025 editions of the National Festival of Arts and Culture (NAFEST) and the International Arts and Crafts (INAC) Expo, marking a renewed commitment after over a decade of non-participation in the national events.

The call was made through a motion sponsored by the Chief Whip and Member representing Mbo State Constituency, Rt. Hon. Effiong Johnson, during Tuesday, October 7, plenary at the Assembly

Complex, Udo Udoma Avenue, Uyo, highlighting the importance of reviving the State's involvement in cultural festivals that promote national unity and economic growth.

Rt. Hon. Johnson recalled that one of the cardinal pillars of the present administration under the ARISE Agenda is Arts, Culture, and Tourism, emphasising that the sector possesses immense potential for fostering unity, encouraging youth creativity, driving economic opportunities, and projecting the State's rich heritage.

He expressed concern that Akwa Ibom's absence from both NAFEST and INAC for over ten years has diminished its visibility and competitiveness in the



national arts and culture space. The Chief Whip noted that the State had previously won numerous laurels in these national events and lamented that continued non-participation could erode those achievements.

The lawmaker further pointed out that states such as Lagos, Cross River, Ekiti, Abia, and Rivers have continued to leverage these festivals for talent development and wealth creation. He therefore urged the State government, through its relevant agencies, to ensure Akwa Ibom's full participation in the 2025 NAFEST to be hosted in Enugu and INAC scheduled to hold in Abuja by the National Council for Arts and Culture (NCAC).

In their contributions, Members representing Uruan and Ibiono Ibom State Constituencies, Hon. Itorobong Etim and Hon. Moses Essien, alongside other legislators, supported the motion, stressing that participation in such cultural platforms would help nurture young talents and showcase Akwa Ibom's cultural excellence.



### The Digital Turn: How Gov. Eno Is Rewriting Civil Service Integrity

t was a drizzling evening of Friday, October 10,2025. The skyline of Uyo was painted in silver mist. Yet, undeterred by the weather, Governor Umo Eno dared the rain. At about 7:30 p.m., his official Mercedes-Benz S580, flags up, glided into the State Secretariat, headlights slicing through the twilight drizzle like strokes of quiet determination.



now don digital robes, fully aligned with the Governor's vision of a modern, efficient bureaucracy.

The Governor's initiative does not merely modernize the recruitment process; it transforms it into a model of integrity. By infusing technology into civil service entry, Governor Eno is building a new culture of trust and accountability—a future where opportunities are earned, not given.

Fresh from the Council of State Meeting in Abuja, the Governor's arrival was neither ceremonial nor perfunctory, it was purposeful. Stepping out of the sleek and crested sedan, he was attired in a finely tailored light brown caftan, a picture of calm precision and quiet strength. His traditional cap, boldly inscribed ARISE and PBAT insignias, progressively framed the elegance he exuded.

It was an evening, when the rain fell and merit rose. Pastor Eno came not for a courtesy stop but to herald a new dawn of merit, technology, and transparency in Akwa Ibom's civil service. This was no ordinary visit; it was a defining statement of intent, an act of leadership that merged vision with courage.

Under the drizzle and soft glow of floodlights, he inspected the newly equipped Computer-Based Test (CBT) Centre, asking questions at every point and reaffirming his administration's unwavering commitment to digitizing public service operations and ensuring merit-based employment.

Governor Eno announced that the State would henceforth conduct all civil service recruitment through the CBT system, a move designed to promote transparency, efficiency, and fairness while ending the shadows of favoritism and godfatherism that once influenced selections.

"The Civil Service is the engine room of governance. The quality of people we bring into the service in this 21st century matters. The world has even moved to AI now, so we need people who at least understand basic computing to the extent that they can take an exam. This system will also eliminate godfatherism. People should have confidence that they got into the service by merit, by passing the required exams. We're in the 21st century, and that's the way it should be," The Governor told the press.

The CBT Centre, designed to accommodate 2,000 candidates per day, stands as a symbol of digital governance in action, a tangible expression of Aspiration 3 of the ARISE Agenda, which seeks "to promote and encourage increased investment in ICT infrastructure in order to develop a digital-based economy for Akwa Ibom State."

The Head of Civil Service, Elder Effiong Essien, who was on ground to receive the Governor, commended his foresight, describing the innovation as "a milestone in e-governance and administrative integrity." He noted that candidates would have opportunities to familiarize themselves with the CBT system ahead of the test, ensuring equal access and fairness.

Echoing this, the ICT whizkid and Commissioner for Science and Digital Economy, Dr. Frank Ekpenyong, affirmed that the facility is equipped with cutting-edge technologies, digitally networked computers, secure data infrastructure, and the capacity to conduct high-volume tests with accuracy and speed.

To both officials, this was more than a project, it was a paradigm shift, signaling that governance in Akwa Ibom now thrives on knowledge, not connection, and that excellence, not influence, is the new key to entry.

That rain-soaked evening, Governor Eno demonstrated more than leadership; he embodied vision. His quiet walk through the Civil Service Auditorium of the State Secretariat reflected his belief that technology is the bridge between aspiration and achievement, and that true reform begins with fair opportunity.

When he finally departed, the drizzle had softened to a mist. The lights from the Secretariat shimmered on the wet pavement, reflecting the silhouette of a leader who dares to dream and to digitize.

The legacy he left behind that evening was more than infrastructure, it was a declaration that Akwa Ibom's civil service has entered a new era: an era where merit meets technology and governance rises on the strength of innovation and integrity.

The inspection of the CBT Centre was not the end of the workday for Governor Eno. His convoy raced down the night to the Governor's Office, where a meeting of the Finance and General Purposes Committee (FGPC) took the chunk of the night, another testament to the Governor's work ethic and relentless commitment to duty.

Indeed, the Civil Service, the backbone of governance, must

## Environment Commissioner Advocates Tree Planting, Responsible Mining Practices

he Commissioner for Environment and Mineral Resources, Rt. Hon. Nsikak Ekong, has reiterated the State government's commitment to promoting environmental sustainability and enforcing responsible mining practices across the State.

Rt. Hon. Ekong stated this when he received a delegation from the Akwa Ibom State Infrastructure and Assets Management and Maintenance Agency (AKIAMMA), on a courtesy visit in his office on Monday, October 6.

The Commissioner highlighted the importance of tree planting as a proactive approach to controlling erosion, restoring ecological balance, and improving the State's environmental resilience. He further advocated the cultivation of economic trees to boost both environmental conservation and economic value.

He urged residents to regularly desilt their drains and avoid dumping refuse into drainage channels, warning that such unhealthy practices contribute significantly to flooding and environmental degradation. The Commissioner also stressed the urgent need for a comprehensive Drainage Master Plan to guide the design and construction of drains in road projects, while cautioning against illegal structures built along rights of way.

Addressing issues in the mining sector, Rt. Hon. Ekong warned that miners involved in dredging without proper registration would face arrest and prosecution. He added that individuals who excavate burrow pits without covering them afterward would also be sanctioned for endangering the environment.

Earlier, the Board Member in charge of Health, Safety, and Environment at AKIAMMA, Prof. Comfort Etok, expressed the agency's readiness to collaborate with the ministry in advancing environmental initiatives. Prof. Etok, who is the immediate past Chairman and current Vice President of the Nigerian Society of Environment, proposed a large-scale tree planting campaign aimed at planting one million trees across the 31 local government areas to mitigate the impact of climate change.

She also presented the Akwa Ibom State Dialogue on

ARISE Agenda in the Environment Sector, to the Commissioner, pledging AKIAMMA's commitment to implementing the environmental blueprints in the document and supporting the growth of the mining sector through sustainable practices.

In his remarks, the Director of Flood Control, Mr. Ita Udoh, commended AKIAMMA for the visit and commitment to partnership, describing the collaboration as timely and strategic. He cautioned residents against indiscriminate refuse disposal, urging them to embrace regular desilting of drains, proper waste management, and environmental stewardship to achieve a cleaner, safer Akwa Ibom.

## Gov Eno Visits Model Secondary School Site in Nsit Ubium, Sets 2026 as Resumption Date

n Monday, October 6, Governor Umo Eno, visited the site of the proposed Model Secondary School in Ikot Akpan Abia, Nsit Ubium Local Government Area, where he reaffirmed his administration's commitment to revolutionise the education sector through the ARISE Education Renewal Initiative.

Describing the project as a major milestone in his vision to redefine learning by combining academic excellence with technical and vocational training, Governor Eno announced plans to replicate similar schools across the three senatorial districts to ensure equitable access to modern, skill-oriented education.

The Governor disclosed that construction will commence immediately after the passage of the supplementary budget, adding that multiple contractors would be engaged to ensure timely delivery and broad community participation.

He further revealed that the Model Secondary School will feature skill acquisition centers in ICT, catering, metal works, and entrepreneurship, enabling students to graduate with both academic knowledge and practical competence. He added that the initiative aims to make secondary schools more polytechnical, equipping students with employable skills before entering tertiary institutions.

To promote agricultural training and self-sustainability among students, the State Chief Executive

announced the allocation of 10 hectares of land for the development of a school farm, assuring that the facility would be completed and ready for student intake by September 2026.

In his remarks, Senator Effiong Bob commended Governor Eno for locating the "magnificent project" in Nsit Ubium, describing it as a testament to visionary leadership and commitment to grassroots development. He urged youths and residents to cooperate with the contractors to ensure smooth execution and timely completion of the project.





## Sports Commissioner Tasks Coaches on Talent Discovery, Devt at Grassroots

The event, held on Sunday, October 5, aimed at reawakening public consciousness on the importance of regular testing, preventive measures, and adherence to safe health practices.

Speaking at the event, the Project Manager of AKSACA, Dr. Enobong Akpan, underscored the significance of public enlightenment in the fight against HIV/AIDS. She urged citizens to embrace regular testing and adopt lifestyles that promote good health and prevention. Dr. Akpan further highlighted that awareness and early detection remain key to achieving the goal of zero HIV infections.

Declaring the agency's commitment to maternal and child health, Dr. Akpan noted that pregnant women living with HIV can access treatment to prevent mother-to-child transmission during pregnancy and breastfeeding. As part of the campaign, free medical screenings were conducted for attendees, including oral HIV/AIDS tests, blood pressure checks, and tuberculosis screening.

In his sermon drawn from Psalm 113, the presiding pastor, Rev. Uwem EtukAkpan, stressed the need for unity and peace among brethren. He reminded the congregation that unity was vital for God's presence and service to humanity. Special prayers were offered for the AKSACA team as they commenced their

sensitisation campaign across all the 31 local government areas of the State.

The initiative was supported through AKSACA partnership with the United States Agency for International Development (USAID). The collaboration enabled the provision of free medical services and educational materials on HIV prevention. The Director of Public Health Services, Ministry of Health, alongside other stakeholders, also lent their support to the outreach.

## Facility Audit Begins at A'Ibom Water Company to Boost Potable Water Delivery



he Akwa Ibom State Government, in collaboration with the Federal Ministry of Water Resources and Sanitation (FMWRS) and the GIBB Consortium, has commenced a comprehensive facility assessment of the Akwa Ibom Water Company Limited (AKWC), as part of efforts to improve access to potable water across the State.

The Commissioner for Water Resources and Sanitation, Hon. Ubuo Ubuo, expressed delight with the visit of the federal officials and consultant, describing the initiative as timely and strategic. He commended the Federal Government for selecting Akwa Ibom as one of the beneficiaries in the ongoing national assessment of State water agencies, stressing that the exercise aligns with Governor Umo Eno's renewed commitment to expanding and upgrading water supply infrastructure.

Dr. Ubuo highlighted the government's significant investments in water infrastructure, aimed at restoring, expanding, and sustaining water supply systems to serve citizens effectively. He, however, acknowledged that some challenges, including facility breakdowns and capacity gaps, still exist and need to be addressed through such collaborative interventions.

The Commissioner assured the delegation of the ministry's cooperation throughout the assessment process. He announced the appointment of a desk officer to act as a liaison between the ministry and the consortium. He further appealed for continued federal support and partnership in unlocking more intervention opportunities in the water and sanitation sector.

The Managing Director, Akwa Ibom Water Company Limited, Engr. Edo Etuk, noted that the engagement followed discussions at the last National Water Council meeting, which underscored the need to strengthen urban and semi-urban water supply systems nationwide. He expressed optimism that the assessment

would form a strong foundation for future interventions and investment decisions.

Speaking on behalf of the Federal Ministry, Engr. Nafiu Kassim, who led the team from the Federal Project Implementation Unit (FPIU) under the African Development Bank (AfDB)-supported programme, explained that the consultants were commissioned to collect baseline data and prepare a Water Supply and Sanitation Investment Plan for six pilot States, including Akwa Ibom. He stated that the assignment would diagnose operational gaps, assess existing infrastructure, and propose investment priorities at no cost to participating States.

Engr. Kassim further revealed that the six-month consultancy would deliver actionable recommendations covering short, medium, and long-term interventions. Upon completion, each participating State would receive a briefing on the findings to ensure ownership and effective implementation of the proposed investment plan.

Leader of the GIBB Consortium, Mr. Wiero Vogelzang, disclosed that the project comprised three key components namely, Technical, Sanitation, and Financial/Institutional assessments, expected to produce an Inception Report, Financial Report, and Institutional Assessment Report. He assured that the consortium's work would help strengthen service delivery and guide future funding decisions.

In a vote of thanks, the Director of Water Resources, Mr. Gideon Akpan, appreciated Governor Eno for prioritising access to clean water and effective sanitation, and the visiting teams for their commitment to enhancing the State's water supply systems. He pledged the ministry's full cooperation to ensure the success of the assessment exercise.





### Nsit Ubium: Charles Reiterates Commitment to Free Education Policy, Donates Learning Materials

he Chairman of Eket Local Government Area, Hon. Akaniyene Tommey, has commended the Rhema Care Integrated **Development Centre** (RIDEC) and the Akwa Ibom State Rural Water Supply and Sanitation Agency (AK-RUWATSAN) for their plan to install chlorinators in public water facilities across Eket



communities. He described the initiative as a critical step toward achieving the United Nations' goals on water and sanitation, essential for public health and economic development.

Hon. Tommey who was represented by the Vice Chairman, Hon. Inyang Akpawan, gave the commendation during a briefing by the RIDEC team at the Chairman's Lodge on the In-line Chlorination Project, which aims to improve access to safe and clean water for vulnerable populations.

On his part, the RIDEC Focal Person, Mr. Christopher Okon, explained that in-line chlorination involves integrating a chlorine-dosing device into water supply lines to automatically disinfect drinking water. This passive method ensures a continuous supply of safe water at community taps.

In addition, Mr. Ini Esak, Head of Water Resources at AK-RUWATSAN, added that the chlorination process is automatic and more reliable than manual methods. He highlighted its cost-effectiveness, reduced health risks, and wastewater treatment benefits, urging field workers to ensure proper maintenance during the eight-month pilot phase.

The pilot scheme will be implemented in five local government areas: Eket, Oron, Okobo, Ikot Ekpene, and Uyo, targeting public water facilities in markets, schools, and community centres.

The event featured an interactive session with stakeholders and officials from RIDEC and AK-RUWATSAN on implementation strategies.

In attendance were council officials, traditional rulers, former lawmakers, political leaders, and community stakeholders.



## Okobo: Henshaw Deepens Empowerment Efforts with N4M Business Support for Women



He further noted that all former Governors of Akwa Ibom State are entitled to, and continue to enjoy, their security details as approved by law.

"To the best of our knowledge, there has been no complaint or report from any former Governor or their

media aides about the withdrawal of security personnel. The rumour exists only in the imagination of those peddling it," Umanah added.

The Commissioner urged members of the public to disregard the baseless propaganda, reaffirming that the peace loving Governor of Akwa Ibom State remains focused on promoting peace, unity, and good governance across the State.

He emphasized that Governor Eno will continue to ensure that all citizens, regardless of political affiliation enjoy the full protection and benefits of the law.
