# Akwa Ibom Youths Endorse Tinubu, Akpabio, Eno for 2027

*• As Gov unveils massive skills acquisition, bursary boost*



**T**he State Governor, Pastor Umo Eno, has announced plans to train 3,100 youths at the Dakkada Skills Acquisition Centre (DASAC) in the next academic session, as part of his administration's drive to equip young people with sustainable skills for the future.

The Governor made the disclosure in Uyo on Tuesday, December 30, while receiving youths who staged a rally endorsing President Bola Tinubu, Senate President Godswill Akpabio, and himself ahead of the 2027 general elections. He thanked the youths for their support and for sustaining a peaceful environment in the State.

Governor Eno said each of the 31 local government areas will nominate 100 trainees to DASAC, 50 sponsored by the State

aviation, 20 as pilots and 20 as engineers, with an additional 10 pilots scheduled for training in January 2026.

Governor Eno emphasised that his administration prioritises empowerment over handouts, stressing that youths must be positioned to compete confidently nationwide. He thanked President Tinubu for releasing funds to States and pledged sustained investment in

government and 50 by local councils, bringing the total number of beneficiaries to 3,100 youths in the upcoming session.

skills acquisition and human capital development.

He also announced a 150 per cent increase in students' bursary, revealing that from January 2026, beneficiaries will receive N50,000, up from the previous N20,000. The Governor urged youths to either pursue formal education or acquire vocational skills, assuring them of government support in both paths.

Speaking at the rally, Hon. Martins Esin, Chairman of the House Committee on Youth Development, Commissioner for Youth Development, Dr. Ekerette Ekanem, and ALGON Chairman, Hon. Uwemedimo Udo assured the Governor of massive youth support in 2027. The event climaxed with a motion adopting Tinubu, Akpabio, and Eno as the youths' sole candidates for the election.

Highlighting other youth-focused initiatives, Governor Eno said the State is constructing youth-friendly centres across all LGAs, equipped with solar power, internet access, and essential facilities, while the Ministry of Youth Development is finalising a comprehensive youth development policy.

He further disclosed that through Ibom Air, 40 Akwa Ibom indigenes have been trained in

# Gov Eno Commissions Primary Health Centre at Nduo Eduo

• *Orders termination of non-performing contracts*



**G**overnor Umo Eno, has commissioned an ultra-modern Primary Health Centre for the people of Nduo Eduo in Eket Local Government Area, describing the project as a special Christmas gift to the community.

Speaking during the commissioning on Monday, December 29, Governor Eno urged community leaders and stakeholders to take collective responsibility in protecting and maintaining the facility, stressing that it was built to improve grassroots healthcare delivery.

The Governor explained that the health centre is part of the One Project Per Local Government Initiative, an electioneering promise he made to the late Elder Ekwo and the people of Nduo Eduo. He commended the Commissioner for Health, Dr. Ekem John, and other officials involved in ensuring the project's timely completion.

Governor Eno expressed concern over delays in similar projects across the State, revealing that nine local government areas are yet to complete their allocated projects more than two and a half years into the administration. He consequently directed that contracts for the affected projects be terminated.

He criticised contractors who collect project funds, abandon work, and later seek cost variations, warning that any contractor or guarantor found culpable after a financial audit would be held accountable for public funds already disbursed.

The Governor also appealed to residents of Eket to maintain peace and avoid disrupting construction activities on the Lagos-Calabar Coastal Highway, particularly along the Stubb's Creek corridor.

Presenting an overview of the project, the Commissioner for Health described the facility as a unique Christmas gift to the people of Eket, fully equipped with modern medical infrastructure including a resuscitation machine, functional laboratory with haematology analyzer, accident and emergency unit, immunisation room, nutrition centre, vaccine store, staff quarters, and solar-powered systems.

In their goodwill messages, Eket Local Government Chairman, Hon. Akaninyene Tommy; APC State Chairman, Obong Stephen Ntukekpo; Chief Assam Assam; Prof. Maurice Ekwo; Prof. Etie Ben and Dr. Edikan Ackley praised Governor Eno's commitment to healthcare development.

The event was attended by the Secretary to the State Government, Prince Enobong Uwah; the Executive Assistant/Chief Delivery Advisor, Mr. Aniefiok Johnson; other members of the State Executive Council; Council Chairmen, and government officials.

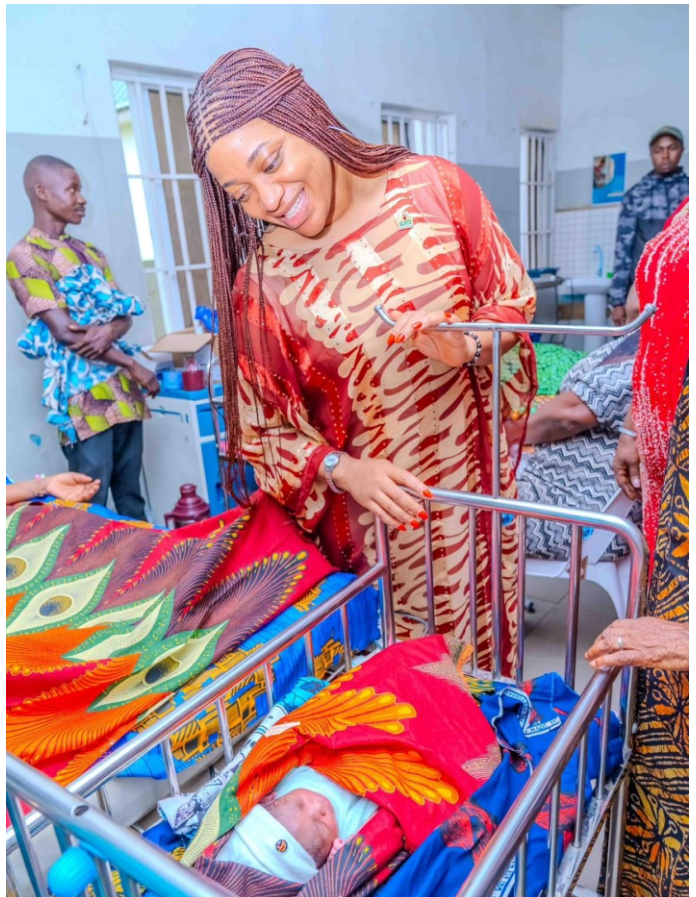

Esin announced that Akwa Ibom youths have unanimously resolved to support President Tinubu, Senate President Akpabio, and Governor Eno for a second term. A motion for the endorsement was moved by the House Leader and Member, Nsit Ubium State Constituency, Rt. Hon. Otobong Bob, seconded by the Chairman, House Committee on Security, Youths and Sports and Member, representing Uyo State Constituency, Hon. Uwemedimo Asuquo.

Also speaking, the Commissioner for Youth Development, Dr. Ekerette Ekanem, said the endorsement followed extensive consultations and reflects youths appreciation of Governor Eno's inclusive and participatory governance style. He added that the youths would further demonstrate their support through a planned solidarity walk and endorsement rally from Ibom Hall grounds to the Globe at Wellington Bassey Way, where they would be addressed by the Governor.

**Y**ouths of the State, under the aegis of Akwa Ibom Youths United, have formally endorsed President Bola Tinubu, Senate President Godswill Akpabio and Governor Umo Eno, for continuity in office beyond 2027, citing their leadership performance and developmental strides at both National and State levels.

# AKIRS Engages Traditional Rulers on Nigeria's New Tax Reform Ahead of 2026 Rollout



**T**he Akwa Ibom State Internal Revenue Service (AKIRS), has intensified its stakeholder sensitisation drive on Nigeria's new tax reform law with a consultation meeting involving the State Supreme Council of Traditional Rulers.

The meeting, held at the Traditional Rulers' Chambers in Uyo, on Tuesday, December 23, formed part of preparations for the implementation of the Federal Government's tax reform scheduled to take effect from January 2026.

Leading the AKIRS delegation, the Chairman, Sir Okon Okon, explained that the engagement was aimed at enlightening traditional rulers as critical stakeholders, securing their buy-in, and encouraging them to relay accurate information on the reform to their subjects.

Sir Okon clarified that the new tax reform, which replaces the obsolete colonial-era tax law, does not introduce new taxes nor increase existing ones. Rather, he said it seeks to harmonize taxes, eliminate multiple taxation, and exempt low-income earners and small and medium-scale enterprise operators from the tax net.

He noted that the reform, aligned with global best practices, would

ease pressure on the State's economy, enhance efficiency and effectiveness in government savings, and promote transparency and integrity in revenue collection, among other benefits.

The AKIRS Chairman, who is also a member of the Presidential Tax Reforms Team for the South-South region, commended the high calibre of Akwa Ibom traditional rulers, describing them as seasoned professionals with deep knowledge of contemporary issues, which he said facilitated productive engagement.

Sir Okon further expressed appreciation to Governor Umo Eno, for the support and enabling environment provided for widespread sensitisation, while calling for collective support to ensure effective tax administration.

Responding on behalf of the traditional institution, the President General of the Supreme Council of Traditional Rulers in Akwa Ibom State, His Eminence, Ntenyin Solomon Etuk thanked the AKIRS team for the briefing and pledged support, urging comprehensive public enlightenment ahead of implementation.

The meeting featured a lecture titled, "Nigeria Tax Reforms: Synopsis of Implications" delivered by Sir Okon Okon, followed by an interactive session with traditional rulers from the 31 local government areas of the State.

# AKHA Passes N1.390trn 2026 Budget, Cuts Spending by 16%

• *Prioritises Capital Projects*



After the passage, the Speaker directed the Clerk of the House, Mrs. Nsikak-Abasi Orok, to transmit a clean copy of the bill to Governor Eno for assent.

He commended the lawmakers for their unity and diligence, and also praised the Assembly's management, staff, and other stakeholders for their contributions to the successful passage of the budget.

Presenting the committee's report earlier, Hon. Etim noted that the N1.390 trillion 2026 budget represents a 16 percent reduction from the N1.650 trillion revised budget approved for the 2025 fiscal year. She added that projected recurrent revenue for 2026 stands at N1.146 trillion, down from N1.259 trillion in 2025, reflecting a 9 percent decrease.

**T**he Akwa Ibom State House of Assembly, has passed the 2026 Appropriation Bill totaling N1.390 trillion, as presented by Governor Umo Eno on Tuesday, November 25.

The bill was approved on Tuesday, December 30, following the presentation of the report by the Chairman of the House Committee on Finance and Appropriation, Hon. Itorobong Etim. The budget provides N354.867 billion for recurrent expenditure and N1.035 trillion for capital expenditure.

A breakdown of the budget shows that the Administration sector will receive N268.555 billion (29.3%), the Social sector N305.509 billion (22.0%), the Economic sector N79.916 billion (5.8%), the Law and Justice sector N23.738 billion (1.7%), while the Regional sector is allocated N2.28 billion (0.2%).

The motion to receive the committee's report was moved by the Deputy Chief Whip and Member representing Oruk Anam State Constituency, Hon. Sampson Idiong, and seconded by Hon. Lawrence Udoide, with unanimous support from the House.

Lawmakers subsequently considered and adopted the bill clause by clause at the Committee of Supply, presided over by the Speaker, Rt. Hon. Udemé Otong. The motion for the third reading was later moved by the House Leader, Rt. Hon. Otobong Bob, and seconded by the Deputy Leader, Hon. Nsidibe Akata.

Earlier, Mr. Ukpong Akpanumo, the Chairman of the Joint Labour Taskforce explained that the dispute is with GMT Energy, other contractors and not with Seplat Energy, highlighting issues of employment denial and minimal pay inconsistent with agreements. The Protesters also noted that prior attempts at communication over five months had failed, prompting the demonstration.





# December 29: Governor Eno's Unrelenting Day of Service

The tone of the day had been set the night before.
