According to the Minister, feedback from all agencies confirmed that Akwa Ibom has surpassed expectations, with only minimal gaps left to close. He noted that contrary to initial assumptions, the State has already progressed towards operating as a full-fledged international airport.

Keyamo expressed satisfaction with the facilities inspected, including the newly completed and well-equipped international terminal and the Maintenance, Repair and Overhaul (MRO) facility. He described the MRO as a critical requirement that enables international airlines to conduct routine aircraft checks before departure.

The Minister praised Akwa Ibom State for its tradition of visionary leadership, noting that successive administrations have consistently built on solid foundations laid by their predecessors. He specifically commended Governor Eno for sustaining and completing the State's aviation master plan.

He said the realisation of plans initiated over 25 years ago reflects effective leadership, adding that Akwa Ibom has been fortunate with leaders who have driven continuity and

sustainable development.

The Governor, in his remarks, corroborated the Minister's stance, acknowledging the contributions of past leaders while thanking President Bola Tinubu for approving the airport's international status and releasing statutory funds for development. He emphasised that the project was executed with State funds, noting that Akwa Ibom currently owes no bank on the project, and reaffirmed commitment to leveraging the airport for economic growth.

Meanwhile, the Minister has described the ongoing ARISE Palm Resort in the State as a 'mind-blowing' tourism asset that will significantly boost operations at the airport, after inspecting the facility at Dominic Utuk Avenue, as part of efforts to ensure that critical infrastructure was in place to support the airport's recent elevation to international status.

Gov Eno Urges Nigerian Youths to Dream Big

•Admonishes Graduants of Mountain Top University to be Shining examples



The State Governor, Pastor Umo Eno, has challenged Nigerian youths to pursue bold dreams while grounding their paths to success in humility, hard work, strong character and unwavering faith in God.

Governor Eno gave the charge while delivering the Convocation Lecture at the 7th Convocation Ceremony of Mountain Top University on Thursday, December 18, at the institution's campus along the Lagos-Ibadan Expressway, Prayer City.

Speaking on the theme, "Dream Big, Start Small," the Governor urged the graduating Class of 2025 to shun shortcuts, entitlement mentality and moral compromise, but instead, embrace discipline, service, resilience and integrity as they transition into life beyond the university.

He noted that rapid technological changes and shifting societal values demand that young people think creatively, act courageously and pursue excellence with character. "Dream big, start small, be passionate, work twice as hard, and watch the Invisible Hands of God lift you to heights you never

imagined possible," the Governor charged.

Governor Eno warned against the lure of instant gratification without effort, describing it as a pathway to frustration and moral decline. He expressed confidence, however, that the moral and intellectual foundation provided by Mountain Top University would distinguish its graduates as future leaders, innovators and change-makers.

Drawing from biblical and contemporary examples, he explained that dreaming big provides vision, while starting small builds capacity and

resilience. He cited the story of Joseph in the Bible and the rise of Amazon founder Jeff Bezos, reminding the graduates that greatness often begins quietly with available resources. "You don't need to be great to start, but you need to start to be great," he said.

In a personal reflection, Governor Eno shared his life journey, from growing up as the son of a police officer who died in active service, hawking soft drinks on the streets of Lagos, to starting the Royalty Hotel in Eket with just five rooms in 1997, which later grew into a major hospitality brand employing thousands. He stressed that faith in God, honesty and hard work attract destiny helpers.

The Governor concluded by urging the graduants to look beyond conventional employment, explore entrepreneurship, innovation and service, and uphold ethical conduct, humility and compassion. Congratulating the Class of 2025, he encouraged them to "dream big, start small, and just start," assuring them that God would lift them to the mountain top of their aspirations.

Gov Eno Attributes State's Peace to God, Security Agencies

Governor Umo Eno, has attributed the prevailing peace, safety and stability in the State to divine grace and the unwavering commitment of security agencies, commending them for their sacrifices in maintaining law and order.

The Governor spoke during the commissioning of 1.4km of newly constructed internal roads at the State Headquarters of the Nigerian Police Force in Ikot Akpan Abia, and the 2025 Christmas Tree Lighting ceremony at the Department of State Services (DSS) in Uyo.

Praising security operatives for working collaboratively, often at great personal risk, to ensure a conducive environment for development. Governor Eno assured them of the State government's appreciation and continued support, noting that without their efforts, the current atmosphere of peace would not be possible. He also announced the approval of contracts for the lighting of police stations across the State to further enhance security operations.

The Governor commended the Commissioner of Police, CP Baba Azare, for effective leadership and prudent deployment of patrol vehicles donated by the State government. He further disclosed plans to strengthen security presence through the construction of a Counter Terrorism Unit (CTU), thanking the Inspector General of Police, IGP Kayode Egbetokun, for approving the siting of the facility in Nsit Ubium Local Government Area.

Reaffirming his administration's commitment to security, Governor Eno pledged sustained support to the Police Command, encouraged an officer whose residence was recently destroyed by fire, and congratulated the Officer-in-Charge of the Special Weapons and Tactics (SWAT) Unit, CSP



Kokoette Ebong, who emerged as Crime Buster of the Year at the 2024 Nigeria Police Force Awards in Abuja. He also disclosed plans to relocate the State Fire Service to the Occupational Safety Department to improve efficiency.

At the DSS headquarters, the Governor further approved the procurement of two new Toyota Hilux vehicles to boost the operational capacity of the agency. He emphasised that strengthening security institutions remains a priority of his administration, as peace and good governance are critical drivers of sustainable development.

Earlier, CP Azare commended Governor Eno for prioritising security, peace and unity, describing the Governor's support to the Police Command as consistent and impactful. He noted that the newly commissioned internal roads are strategic assets that will significantly improve mobility, response time and operational efficiency, assuring continued collaboration with the State Government to sustain peace and safety.



Providing an overview of the project, the Commissioner for Works and Fire Service, Prof. Eno Ibanga, explained that the road construction was prompted by the Governor's visit to the area in 2024, when he observed its deplorable condition. He assured that the roads were constructed to high quality standards and are expected to last at least 20 years.

The two events were attended by the Deputy Governor, Senator Akon Eyakenyi; the Secretary to the State Government, Prince Enobong Uwah; senior government officials, political leaders, captains of industry and members of the public.

Gov Eno Unveils First-Ever State Govt Pavilion at Christmas Unplugged 3.0

On Saturday, December 13, Governor Umo Eno unveiled the first-ever State Government Pavilion at the ongoing Christmas Unplugged 3.0, marking a significant step towards deepening citizens engagement and showcasing the practical impact of the ARISE Agenda.

The pavilion, located within the Christmas Village at Unity Park, Udo Udoma Avenue, Uyo, was introduced on the Governor's directive to bring governance closer to the people. It brings together Ministries, Departments and Agencies (MDAs) in a single interactive space where residents and visitors can access information on government programmes, innovations, service delivery initiatives, and investment opportunities aligned with the State's development blueprint.

During a tour and inspection of the pavilion, Governor Eno issued a decisive directive aimed at strengthening healthcare delivery across the State. He instructed the Head of the Civil Service and the Commissioner for Health to redeploy all medical doctors currently serving as Permanent Secretaries in unrelated MDAs back to the health sector to serve as heads of government-owned general hospitals, while retaining their administrative responsibilities.

The Governor stressed that medical expertise must not be underutilised, especially at a time when the State is intensifying efforts to strengthen healthcare services and improve emergency response across public health institutions.

Governor Eno expressed satisfaction with the creativity, coordination, and clarity of vision demonstrated by the MDAs at the pavilion, noting that their presentations clearly reflected the people-centred focus and policy direction of his administration. He commended the alignment of programmes and initiatives with the ARISE Agenda.

"I have gone round to see what the Ministries, Departments and Agencies are doing, and I am pleased that they are promoting the ARISE Agenda. This is the first time we are introducing a State Government Pavilion at the Christmas Village, and what I have seen so far is very encouraging," the Governor stated.

Reaffirming his administration's commitment to effective governance, Governor Eno emphasised that all MDAs must continually align their operations and service delivery frameworks with the State's development vision. He added that the State Government Pavilion remains a major highlight of Christmas Unplugged 3.0, reinforcing his resolve to make governance visible, accessible, people-focused, and results-driven.

Additionally, the State Chief Executive approved the employment of an orphan graduate, Miss Abigail Okon, after she was presented to him by the Ministry of Women Affairs and Social Welfare. He directed the Head of Service, to offer her an appointment in the State civil service, maintaining that one's background or circumstances of birth should not determine destiny.

A'Ibom Strengthens Cholera Preparedness, Flags Off Training for 350 Workers

The Commissioner for Health, Dr. Ekem John, has declared open the Cholera Sample Management and Rapid Diagnostic Testing (RDT) Training for 350 health workers, reinforcing preparedness and response capacity against cholera outbreaks.

The 10-day training, scheduled from 9-18 December, took place at the NLC Conference Hall, Atan Offot, Uyo, and brought together participants from the three senatorial districts of the State, to strengthen skills in cholera detection, sample handling, surveillance, and case management.

Addressing the participants, the Commissioner for Health, commended the World Health Organization (WHO), Nigeria Centre for Disease Control (NCDC), National Facilitators, and the State Epidemiology Unit of the Directorate of Public Health Services for their sustained support for public health. He noted that recent cholera outbreaks in Akwa Ibom were successfully contained without fatalities, attributing the achievement to the vigilance, competence, and professionalism of health workers.

The Commissioner urged the trainees to take full advantage of the exercise in order to serve as ambassadors of best practices in disease surveillance, early reporting, and effective case management across their respective duty posts, stressing that the medical profession demands integrity, empathy, and ethical responsibility.

Dr. John expressed appreciation to the Governor for his transformative leadership and the declaration of a State of Emergency in Healthcare, noting visible improvement in infrastructure, service delivery, and health outcomes. He also paid tribute to the State Epidemiologist, Dr. Nchiek Eneh,



describing her as a dedicated and committed example of public service.

Welcoming participants, the Director of Public Health Services, Dr. Etop Antia, described the training as timely and critical to strengthening epidemic preparedness in the State. He attributed Akwa Ibom's recent success in managing cholera outbreaks without casualties to improved surveillance systems and the dedication of frontline health workers, while thanking the Commissioner for his consistent support.



In their goodwill messages, the WHO State Coordinator, Dr. Alawole OluwaBukola, and the NCDC representative, Mr. Jubril Kareem, lauded the State strong leadership in public health emergency management and reaffirmed continued support in surveillance, laboratory networking, data analysis, and rapid response.

The training, running concurrently across the three senatorial districts, is expected to significantly enhance capacity for early detection, rapid response, and prevention of future cholera outbreaks.

The Oku Ibom Ibibio, His Eminence, Ntenyin Solomon Etuk, has called on members of Mboho Mkparawa Ibibio and Akwa Ibom indigenes to embrace unity and give sustained support to the ongoing economic and institutional reforms of President Bola Tinubu, as well as the ARISE Agenda of Governor Umo Eno, describing both initiatives as vital pathways to strategic transformation, peace and shared prosperity.

The General Assembly featured the Presidential Night of Distinction and End-of-Year Gala, during which past leaders were honoured for their enduring contributions and legacy, while chapters and distinguished members received recognition for outstanding service and commitment.



A'Ibom Targets Malaria Reduction as Health Ministry Inaugurates ITN Campaign Committee



The Commissioner for Health, Dr. Ekem John, has inaugurated the Insecticide-Treated Nets (ITNs) Campaign Coordinating Committee (ICCC) as part of renewed efforts to reduce malaria prevalence across the State.

Inaugurating the Committee on Wednesday, December 10, at the Ministry of Health Conference Room in Uyo, the Commissioner, who spoke through the Permanent Secretary, Dr. Patrick Essiet, noted that malaria remains a major public health challenge with severe consequences on children, pregnant women, household productivity, and socio-economic development.

Dr. John emphasised that malaria is preventable, stressing that consistent use of insecticide-treated nets significantly reduces infection rates and malaria-related deaths. The Commissioner also announced that the State, in collaboration with national and international partners, will soon begin a large-scale mass distribution of ITNs to ensure every household has access to the intervention.

He outlined the committee's responsibilities to include resource mobilisation, coordination of implementing partners, security of personnel and commodities across the 31 local government areas, monitoring household mobilisation, and ensuring effective last-mile delivery of nets to communities statewide.

The Commissioner commended development partners, particularly the Against Malaria Foundation for donating over 3.9 million ITNs, as well as the United States Government and

the Global Health Supply Chain programme for operational support. He also acknowledged civil society groups, traditional institutions, the media, frontline health workers, and Ibom Air for supporting the State Malaria Elimination Programme, including the donation of 50,000 doses of sulphadoxine-pyrimethamine.

Earlier, the Director of Public Health Services reaffirmed the ministry's readiness to ensure a successful campaign, while the State Malaria Elimination Programme Manager outlined the campaign strategy, logistics, ICT deployment, and community mobilisation plans.

Speaking at the event, the Executive Chairman of SUBEB, Rt. Hon. Anietie Etuk, commended Governor Umo Eno for his sustained investment in basic education, particularly the timely release of counterpart funding which, he said, made the successful hosting of the exhibition possible.

MOI Defends 2026 Budget Estimate

•Seeks increased overhead allocation for effective media operations

In view of the rising costs associated with media operations, including advert placements, live broadcasts, and publicity, the Ministry of Information has sought an increase in its overhead allocation for the 2026 fiscal year.

Making the request during a budget defence session held on Thursday, December 11, at the Akwa Ibom State House of Assembly temporary chambers in Luton Park, Uyo, the Commissioner, Rt. Hon. Aniekan Umanah, said increment in the overhead cost will aid effective media operations.

Umanah, who presented the budget before the House Committee on Appropriation and Finance, chaired by Hon. Itoro Etim, the Member representing Uruan State Constituency, disclosed a proposed budget estimate of N15,383,616,190.00 for the 2026 fiscal year.

The proposal according to him includes, revenue cost, personnel cost, overhead cost, and capital expenditure, stressing that the significant portion of the budget was allocated to overhead costs, which are essential for the ministry's core operations.

During the session, the Commissioner explained that the ministry had received N4,388,763,137.15 in 2025 budget



releases, with additional capital releases still pending. He acknowledged the committee's support and emphasised the importance of addressing the growing costs in media operations to ensure that the ministry's functions, such as public engagement, advertising, and media outreach, remain effective and up-to-date.

He further stated that the increase in the overhead allocation was necessary to meet media publicity programmes, which are vital to the state's information dissemination efforts.

Umanah expressed appreciation to the committee for the opportunity to present the ministry's position and pledged continuous collaboration to ensure a seamless budget process for the 2026 fiscal year.

Hon. Itoro Etim, in her response, commended the ministry for its clear presentation and requested further clarification on the ministry's revenue generation strategies. She advised the ministry to formally submit its request for the proposed overhead increase in writing to the committee for further review.




