

Gov Eno, Naval Chief Strengthen Alliance on Security of National Assets

Governor Umo Eno, has reaffirmed his administration's commitment to strengthening its partnership with the Nigerian Navy to safeguard critical national assets and ensure the continued security of lives and property across the State.

Governor Eno, who made the pledge on Wednesday, November 3, while hosting the new Chief of Naval Staff, Vice Admiral Idi Ibbas, on a courtesy visit at Government House, Uyo, congratulated him on his recent appointment, describing it as a well-earned recognition of his distinguished service to the nation.

Noting that the visit was an honour to the State and a testament to the cordial relationship that exists between the Akwa Ibom State Government and the Nigerian Navy, the Governor emphasised that the appointment of Vice Admiral Ibbas came at a pivotal moment in Nigeria's security landscape. He stressed that the nation requires strong, strategic military leadership to address emerging threats, while expressing appreciation to President Bola Tinubu for the choice of a leader he described as competent and committed.

Reiterating Akwa Ibom's dedication to maintaining peace and stability, Governor Eno said the State works in close synergy with security agencies and has achieved significant progress in crime prevention. He assured the Naval Chief that his administration would continue to provide the necessary support to ensure effective security operations.

He highlighted the State's extensive coastline

and growing maritime investments, and called for stronger naval presence to protect vital assets, including upcoming industrial projects such as the BUA refinery and existing operations like the QIT base. The Governor further disclosed that the State had already identified a suitable site for a naval base or outpost and expressed readiness to issue Certificate of Occupancy without delay.

Governor Eno also commended the Flag Officer in Akwa Ibom for advancing the State's request for a naval base, noting that enhanced naval deployment would significantly bolster maritime safety and economic development. He reaffirmed the government's unwavering commitment to strengthening collaborations with the Navy for more efficient and coordinated security outcomes.

In his remarks, Vice Admiral Idi Ibbas thanked Governor Eno for the warm reception and explained that his visit was part of a nationwide operational tour, aimed at gaining firsthand knowledge of the state of naval units and formations. He said the assessment would enable him to identify operational gaps and formulate appropriate solutions to bolster security effectiveness.

The Naval Chief described Akwa Ibom as a highly strategic State endowed with vital natural resources and infrastructure that contribute significantly to the national economy. He called for deeper collaboration between the State Government and the Nigerian Navy to prevent vandalism, protect maritime investments, and safeguard national assets from criminal elements.

Pastor Eno Signs Executive Order Prohibiting Masquerade Activities on A'lbon Streets

• CP Azare assures immediate, statewide enforcement



Pastor Umo Eno, has signed an Executive Order prohibiting masquerade displays on streets and major highways across the State, a move aimed at safeguarding residents and ensuring a peaceful yuletide season.

The order, signed at Government House, Uyo, reinforces the administration's resolve to curb harassment, intimidation, and other security concerns often associated with street masquerade activities.

Governor Eno, while acknowledging the cultural significance of masquerades, said the decision became necessary following recurring incidents of violence and public disorder linked to such performances. He noted that the State could no longer condone practices that endanger lives, disrupt traffic flow, or infringe on citizens' rights under the guise of cultural expression.

The Governor recalled recent incidents, including a case where a young woman was stripped and assaulted by masqueraders, stressing that no cultural practice should undermine human dignity or threaten public safety. He reiterated that while cultural displays remain welcome, they must be confined to designated village squares, in line with the 2022 law requiring police clearance for such activities.

Governor Eno urged residents to familiarise themselves with the provisions and implications of the Executive Order, warning that the State will not tolerate any attempt to disrupt public order during or after the festive season. He emphasised that the directive is not a ban on culture but a firm stance

against its misuse to cause chaos or violate the law.

He further appealed to citizens to channel their energies toward cultural and tourism engagements that positively project Akwa Ibom State, and align with the ARISE Agenda's tourism development goals. According to him, maintaining order is crucial as the State prepares to welcome visitors during the Christmas celebrations.

Expressing appreciation to security agencies for their cooperation, noting that their support is vital to sustaining a peaceful environment, the Governor also maintained that the order is part of broader efforts to reassure tourists and residents that Akwa Ibom is safe, organised, and committed to upholding public decency.

Earlier, the State Commissioner of Police, CP Baba Azare, commended Governor Eno for the decisive and timely action, describing the Executive Order as a necessary intervention to address the growing menace posed by masquerade activities. He noted that the order provides clear legal grounds for security agencies to act swiftly and professionally.

CP Azare announced that operational directives have already been issued to Area Commanders and tactical units to ensure immediate and full enforcement across all the 31 LGAs. He assured the public that the police will implement the order diligently to restore and maintain public peace throughout the festive season and beyond



Gov Eno Welcomes Oriental Energy, Strengthens Investment Ties with Alhaji Indimi



Governor Umo Eno, has expressed appreciation to the Executive Chairman of Oriental Energy, Alhaji Mohammed Indimi, and his management team for visiting the State, reaffirming his administration's willingness to strengthen collaboration with the company.

Speaking on Wednesday, December 3, at Government House, Uyo, Governor Eno described the company's engagement with the State government as warm and reassuring, noting that Oriental Energy has maintained a longstanding presence in Akwa Ibom.

Acknowledging Oriental Energy's significant support to the State Security Trust Fund, the State Chief Executive maintained that it was a testament to the company's commitment to ensuring a safe environment for business. He assured that the State would continue to provide a peaceful and stable atmosphere for investors, inviting Oriental Energy to explore investment possibilities at the Ibom Deep Sea Port, as it holds enormous potential for mutual benefit.

In his remarks, Alhaji Mohammed Indimi declared that Akwa Ibom remains the best State for investments given its peaceful, secure and hospitable nature.

He commended the hosts communities for creating an enabling environment for the company to thrive, enumerating some of the impactful Corporate Social Responsibility programmes of his company, and assured willingness to partner with the State in different areas of development.

Similarly, the Executive Vice Chairman, Engr. Goni Sheikh noted that their area of primary operation is Akwa Ibom State, adding that they have been living peacefully in the State for many years. He outlined CSR projects in the communities to include scholarships and medical support, lauding the host communities for their uncommon cooperation.



A'Ibom Advances Vision for World-Class Medical City

Governor Umo Eno, has reaffirmed his commitment to delivering accessible and top-tier healthcare through the development of the Ibom Medical City, a flagship project anchored on the ARISE Agenda.

Speaking with Government House Correspondents after inspecting ongoing construction at Ikot Ada Idem in Ibiono Ibom Local Government Area, the Governor emphasised that the emerging medical complex will equally serve as a strong driver of tourism in the State.

He noted that the Ibom Medical City, comprising the Ibom International Hospital, an Elderly Home, a world-class Diagnostics Centre, a pharmaceutical industry, a housing estate, and other complementary facilities, was conceived to attract medical tourists while providing comprehensive services to residents. According to him, every component of the project aligns with his administration's broader vision of using tourism as a catalyst for development across sectors.

Governor Eno explained that his government is integrating tourism into all key initiatives, including aviation, resorts, infrastructure, agriculture, and heritage promotions. He assured that within the next year, the impact of these coordinated investments will become evident statewide as they gradually take shape.

Describing the medical city as a long-term vision under steady execution, the Governor said the project is being implemented in stages to ensure quality, sustainability, and proper alignment with global standards. He added that the emerging facility is designed as a one-stop medical hub, where a wide range of healthcare services can be accessed without the need for referral outside the State.

To support future expansions, Governor Eno disclosed plans to acquire an additional 100 hectares of land. This



expansion, he said, will accommodate more medical infrastructure, including the State-owned pharmaceutical industry, which aims to boost local drug production and reduce dependence on external suppliers.

The Governor used the opportunity to call on private investors to partner with the State government in key development areas of the medical city. He emphasised that public-private collaboration remains crucial in establishing durable, world-class medical services.

Reiterating the centrality of health to overall welfare, Governor Eno stressed the importance of establishing an internationally accredited diagnostics centre within the complex. Such a facility, he said, will not only improve service delivery for Akwa Ibom people but also attract patients from across Nigeria and beyond.

He further revealed that the strategic location of the medical city, along the route to the Four Points by Sheraton Hotel, was deliberately chosen to complement its tourism value by providing convenient five-star hospitality to medical tourists. He added that a dedicated power grid is being installed to guarantee uninterrupted electricity, describing the initiative as ambitious but fully achievable.



The Governor was accompanied on the inspection by key government officials, including the Executive Assistant and Chief Delivery Advisor, Mr. Aniefiok Johnson; the State Surveyor-General, Mrs. Emem Isang; Commissioner for Lands and Town Planning, Mr. Ubong Inyang, his Housing counterpart, Dr. Henry Archibong and other government functionaries.

Ibom Unity Concert: Pastor Eno Renews Call for Statewide Unity

The State Governor, Pastor Umo Eno, has renewed the call for unity among Akwa Ibom people, urging citizens to rise above political, ethnic, and ideological divides in the collective pursuit of peace and progress.

Governor Eno made the call during the Ibom Unity Concert, held at the International Worship Centre, Uyo, on Saturday, December 6.

President Tinubu Applauds One Billion Naira Family Empowerment Scheme in A'Ibom

Says scheme will be replicated nationwide

President Bola Tinubu, has praised the One Billion Naira Family-Based Empowerment Initiative, introduced in by the Member Representing Ukanafun/Oruk Anam Federal Constituency, Rt. Hon. Unyime Idem, describing it as a transformative model capable of significantly reducing poverty across Nigeria.

The President's message was delivered by Vice President Kashim Shettima at the launch of the Renewed Hope/ARISE Agenda Family Business Grant, held on Saturday, December 6, at the Unyime Idem Empowerment Centre, Ukanafun.



Noting that empowering Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) remains one of the most effective strategies for breaking the cycle of poverty, President Tinubu added that the programme seamlessly aligns with the Renewed Hope Agenda of the Federal Government, while complementing Governor Umo Eno's ARISE Agenda in Akwa Ibom State.

Describing Governor Eno as an exemplary leader, the President commended his people-focused governance style, which he said has strengthened public confidence in leadership. He affirmed the Federal Government's support for the Governor and acknowledged his collaborative approach to development.

President Tinubu further highlighted the uniqueness of the initiative, observing that it was the first time a federal legislator was empowering one thousand families with a total package of one billion naira. He assured that the model would be studied and replicated across other

federal constituencies in the country.

In his remarks, Governor Eno stated that the initiative complements broader Federal and State governments efforts to address unemployment and cushion the economic challenges faced by citizens. He described the intervention as impactful and far-reaching.

Represented by the Deputy Governor, Senator Akon Eyakenyi, the Governor commended Rt. Hon. Idem, noting that although one thousand families were benefiting in the first phase, the ripple effect would be felt across every community in the constituency. He stressed that the injection of one billion naira would stimulate local commerce and enhance the living standards of residents.

The Convener of the programme, Rt. Hon. Unyime Idem, said the scheme was designed to help families establish sustainable businesses and break free from poverty. He disclosed that one thousand families would receive one million naira each in the first phase, while all five thousand identified families would benefit in subsequent phases. He reaffirmed his commitment to attracting more development to the constituency.

The event, chaired by Senator Effiong Bob, was described as unprecedented and a testament to effective representation. The ceremony attracted over 20 National Assembly members and political leaders, and featured the symbolic presentation of cheques to one thousand beneficiary families, selected three per village, across the Ukanafun/Oruk Anam Federal Constituency.



Civil Service Recruitment: 12,502 Candidates Cleared for Oral Interview

• **As Pastor Eno approves N50,000 support for 33,461 CBT participants**

Pastor Umo Eno, has approved the invitation of 12,502 candidates who scored 50 percent and above in the recent Civil Service Computer-Based Test (CBT) for the next stage of the recruitment exercise, an oral interview scheduled to begin in January 2026.

The Governor also authorized a ₦50,000 transport and lunch allowance for each of the 33,461 applicants who participated in the CBT screening, a gesture aimed at easing the financial burden of job seekers and demonstrating the administration's commitment to fairness and welfare.

Governor Eno issued the directives during the formal presentation of the recruitment report by a committee comprising the Head of Civil Service, Mrs. Elsie Peters, the Commissioner for Science and Digital Economy, Dr. Frank Ekpenyong, the Chairman of the State Civil Service Commission, Mrs. Ekerebong Umoh, the Rector of the Dakkada Skills Acquisition Centre, Prof. Enoidem Usoroh and other key officials.

He tasked the committee with ensuring a smooth transition into the oral interview phase and emphasised the importance of maintaining transparency, meritocracy, and professionalism throughout the recruitment process.



The Governor further directed the Head of Civil Service, to commence preparations for the induction of newly recruited safety officers and lawyers, while also initiating comprehensive safety audits across all Ministries, Departments, Agencies (MDAs), and major public facilities.

According to him, these safety audits will help ensure that government institutions are equipped with essential safety tools and protocols required to protect workers and citizens who access public infrastructure.

Presenting the report earlier, the Commissioner for Digital Economy, Dr. Frank Ekpenyong, disclosed that 37, 314 individuals applied for the recruitment exercise, out of which 33,461 undertook the CBT, and 12,502 met the 50 percent benchmark set for advancement to the oral interview stage.

In their remarks, the Head of Service, the Chairman of the Civil Service Commission, and the Rector of DASAC, expressed appreciation to the Governor for entrusting them with the process. They commended his insistence on a transparent, credible, and merit-driven recruitment system and reaffirmed their commitment to delivering on his vision.



Uyo:Udo Reinforces People-Centred Devt Approach in 2026 Budget Process

• **Reaffirms commitment to media freedom**



Nigeria's First Lady Boosts Disability Inclusion in A'lbom

• *Unveils N50m business grants*



The First Lady of Nigeria, and National Chairman of the Renewed Hope Initiative (RHI), Senator Oluremi Tinubu, has rolled out a N50 million economic empowerment programme for Persons With Disabilities in Akwa Ibom State, marking the 2025 International Day of Persons with Disabilities.

The initiative forms part of a nationwide intervention, targeted at strengthening the livelihoods of vulnerable citizens through business support.

Speaking at the launch, held at the Banquet Hall of Government House, Uyo, Senator Tinubu, represented by the Coordinator, Office of the First Lady, Lady Helen Obareki, and delivered through the Commissioner for Women Affairs and Social Welfare, Hon. Inibehe Etukudo, announced that 250 persons with disabilities in every State and the FCT are receiving N200,000 each as business recapitalisation grants.

She explained that each State, including the FCT, had been allocated N50 million for onward disbursement to beneficiaries, bringing the total number of empowered persons nationwide to 9,500. The First Lady said the programme directly aligns with President Bola Tinubu's Renewed Hope Agenda, which prioritises inclusive growth and ensures that vulnerable groups are not left behind.

Senator Tinubu further revealed that the PWD empowerment scheme, valued at N1.9 billion nationwide, will henceforth

be held annually on December 3, to commemorate the International Day of Persons With Disabilities. She urged beneficiaries to utilise the funds responsibly and transform their businesses into sustainable sources of income for themselves and their families.

She expressed appreciation to Governor Umo Eno and the First Lady Designate, Lady Obareki, for supporting and hosting the empowerment. Their collaboration, she said, reflects a shared commitment to social inclusion and the welfare of persons with special needs.

Health Sector Receives Boost as Global Fund Donates Digital X-ray Machines



The Ministry of Health, has taken delivery of five Portable Digital X-ray Machines, donated by the Global Fund through the Knowledge Network for Disease Control and Vigilance (KNCV) Nigeria, marking a significant step in the State's Tuberculosis (TB) diagnostic capacity and community health response.

Speaking at the official handover and commissioning held in Uyo recently, the Commissioner for Health, Dr. Ekem John expressed profound gratitude to the Global Fund and KNCV Nigeria, describing the equipment as a strategic investment that will directly improve early TB detection, surveillance, and access to quality care across the State.

Dr. John noted that the donation aligns with the ministry's ongoing efforts to enhance diagnostic infrastructure, empower frontline health workers, and expand TB case finding, particularly in underserved and hard-to-reach communities. The mobility of the machines, he said, will now allow residents in remote areas to access high-quality chest X-rays without the barrier of distance or insufficient facilities.

He commended Global Fund for its longstanding support to Nigeria's health sector and praised KNCV Nigeria for providing technical leadership and operational guidance in strengthening TB control efforts.

Representing Governor Umo Eno, the Commissioner highlighted that the State government has declared a State of Emergency in the health sector and is addressing gaps through both "software and

hardware" reforms, including the recruitment of over 3,000 health workers and a salary adjustment above 30%.

Reaffirming the State's commitment to accountability and effective utilisation of resources, Dr. John assured partners that the X-ray machines will be deployed responsibly for maximum public benefit. He added that chest X-rays for TB screening will remain free, just like TB treatment, in line with the State's drive for equitable healthcare access.

The Executive Director of KNCV Nigeria, Dr. Bartrand Odume, applauded the Akwa Ibom State Government for its strong commitment to TB control and continuous investment in diagnostic services. He stated that the donation aligns with KNCV's mandate to support States in strengthening TB response systems, and pledged ongoing collaboration in technical support, supervision, and data-driven case detection.

Goodwill messages were delivered by the Permanent Secretary, Hospital Management Board, Dr. Abraham Inyangudo, represented by Dr. Boniface Effiong, who congratulated the ministry for achieving another milestone in upgrading diagnostic services. He assured that the Board will ensure optimal deployment of the equipment.

The event concluded with a vote of thanks by the Head of the TB Programme, Dr. Bassey Akpan, and the official commissioning of the digital X-ray machines by the Commissioner for Health.


